VILLAGE PRESIDENT

As I write this quarterly newsletter I am enjoying the first warm southern breezes of a long-awaited spring. Its time to do the spring cleaning and prepare for the warm days of summer. There is rarely a dull moment in Greenville and this past year has created a lot of change for all of us. Our staff is embracing new leadership and adding a newly renovated building. We are tackling a long overdue review of parcel zoning categories and we may be reaching out to you as we align parcels across the municipality to the appropriate zoning category. Our incorporation as a village has been certified, but the work is not yet complete.

On March 1, we welcomed Travis Parish as the new Village Administrator of Greenville. Travis comes to us as the previous administrator of the village of Harrison. As Greenville's administrator, we look for Travis to lead our staff and our residents toward the desired vision for our community. We know Greenville's residential growth is strong and needs little promotion. We look for Travis and staff to market Greenville as a desired community for business development. We have all worked hard the last few years to establish the preferred pockets of the community for commercial and industrial growth, which

brings in very desirable tax base. Travis also comes to us right as we

are shuffling staff among the municipal buildings.

With the fire department and EMS taking occupancy of the new fire hall, it opened up their previous home for other town staff to utilize. Our Public Works and Parks Departments have moved into the newly renovated Municipal Services Center (MSC). This is the building to come to for things like yard waste permit stickers and park pavilion rentals. With certain staff moving offices to MSC, it also gave our staff an opportunity to reorganize at Village Hall. Minor updates have been made to allow for all our staff to focus on customer service. As citizens come to our municipal buildings for their desired service, it is important to have the right staff helping you get your questions answered and needs met.

In January, Greenville received their certification to incorporate a large portion of the community as a Village. Board meetings have several new faces as we appointed and elected members to occupy seats on both the Village and the Town Board. Staff has been amazing at juggling the efforts of working with two separate municipalities (Town & Village). We hope this is a short-term need as the plan for staff keeping them occupied our community all along is to move forward as one. To accomplish this, we are

looking to complete a consolidation annexation in the next few months. This is by no means a simple task. It requires public hearings and notices to those living in the Town of Greenville. In the end, a vote by the Town Board will allow our community to be one again with the advantage of controlling our own planning, eliminating the risk of annexation, and truly promote our desired quality of living.

Another large effort being driven by staff is a comprehensive review of our parcel zonina categories. Through the approved Village Comprehensive Plan, staff was directed to re-define the parcel zoning categories as well as fully review the current zoning uses throughout the community. Many of you may be impacted by a needed rezoning. We are working hard to clearly define the criteria and justification for rezoning. If your parcel is impacted, you will be notified of the reasoning for rezoning, educated on what it means for you, and have an opportunity to discuss your desired outcome.

As you have read, our staff is extremely busy and no dust is settling under their feet. Just as we as citizens are busy with our projects around the home, there are countless projects being worked on by our town through 2021 and beyond. Greenville continues to be a desired community for all.

Yard Waste Site

The Yard Waste Site is open to all Greenville residents who have purchased a permit to use the site. Yard Waste Site Permits can be purchased at the Municipal Services Center (W6865-A Parkview Drive) or using the Purchasing Form on our website. The cost for a 2021 Yard Waste Site Permit is \$20. Additional stickers within the same household are sold at a discounted price of \$10 per sticker. Permits are good for one calendar year. The Yard Waste Site Policy, along with accepted material, can be found on the Brush Pickup and Yard Waste Site page of the website. Extended hours of operation at the Yard Waste Site will begin April 1 and are as follows:

Monday – Thursday 7:00am – 7:00pm Friday 8:00am – 12:00pm Saturday 9:00am – 3:00pm (With the exception of Holidays)

Free Tire Drop-Off

Spring Dates:

Wednesday, April 14 - Thursday, April 22, 2021

Fall Dates:

Wednesday, September 15 – Thursday, September 23, 2021

Collection is limited to Greenville Residents only, with a limit of 4 tires per household. Tires will not be accepted at the Yard Waste Site during any other time, however tires can be dropped off at the Outagamie County Landfill for a fee. Tires from businesses are not accepted. Only tires with a rim size of 18" or less will be accepted at no charge. For all tires with a rim size of 19" or larger in size or quantities of over 4, the resident will be charged \$6.00 per tire at the Municipal Service Center; or \$200.00 per ton if taken directly to the Outagamie County Landfill/Recycling Center (1419 Holland Rd, Appleton).

Brush Pick-Up (the old Greenville firehouse)

Brush pickup begins the second Monday of every month, year round. Collection may take up to a week to complete. Residents who would like to participate in brush pickup will need to call (920)757-7276 or email publicworks@townofgreenville.com to be added to the collection list no later than 12pm the Friday before. Please review the full Brush Pick-up Policy located on our website before being added to the collection list.



Parks Information

Our parks are open year round but with a new season fast approaching, we want to remind everyone to follow all park rules. The safety and enjoyment of village parks involves the cooperation of everyone!

- Park Hours are 7:00am 10:00pm
- Park restrooms will be open by May 1st
- Pets are not allowed in the parks. Dogs may be walked on the trail if they are leashed and properly cleaned up after.
- Do not park on the grass.
- Glass containers are not allowed in the parks.
- Please deposit litter and recyclables in the appropriate receptacles.
- Motorized vehicles are not allowed on the trails. This includes cars, four wheelers, motorized scooters or any other device powered by an electric or gas motor.
- Do not leave hot ashes in the grills.

Street Trees

Subdivisions with curb and gutter, and lots with lawns already installed, will start to see shade trees being planted in the spring. Property owners that are scheduled for planting will receive a letter and care instructions prior to planting. Proper care in the first few years after planting is very important for the establishment and health of the trees.

Programs & Recreation

Greenville offers many programs and opportunities for residents to get involved or interact with their community.

Community Movie Night: Admissions are FREE and movies are shown rain or shine! Watch our Facebook page for this year's schedule and event updates.

Tennis Lessons: Lessons are held twice a week for six weeks at Jennerjohn Park and taught by qualified instructors, based on the United States Professional Tennis Registry standard of teaching. Registration begins on April 12.

Landscape Beautification Award:

Recognize the efforts of a neighbor, businesses or organization in Greenville that helps beautify the community through outstanding landscape improvements and maintenance.

Memorial Trees: Donate a tree in honor or memory of a loved one. Trees will be planted in spring or fall, depending on the type of tree and best care.

Memorial Benches: This program provides the opportunity to donate a bench in honor or memory of a loved one. To have your bench placed this year, forms and payments are due no later than June 1.

Landscaping in the Right-Of-Way

As described in §265-13 of Greenville's ordinances, residents are required to obtain a permit before preforming any landscaping in the right-of-way. This includes planting of any vegetative material including trees, shrubs, perennials and annuals (excluding lawns) and/or installation of any hardscape materials. Permits are only available in curb and gutter situations. Landscaping of any kind is not allowed in any Town ditches.

GREENVILLE SANITARY

Hydrant Flushing

The Greenville Sanitary District will be flushing and exercising hydrants beginning in May. This process typically takes approximately two weeks.

The Public Service Commission and Wisconsin DNR require the Village to flush the water distribution system, including the fire hydrants. Flushing hydrants is essential to keep your water safe and maintaining the distribution system. This also helps to ensure that hydrants are in good working order for the Fire Department's use.

During this process, you might notice that your water appears cloudy. This is normal and you can still drink the water. If you run the cold water tap that is located closest to your water meter, this will help to clear it up. If you have questions, you can contact the Public Works Office at (920)757-7276.

Leak Detection Program

The Sanitary District has started a Leak
Detection Program to help find possible
water lateral leaks. Frequent sump pump
usage when water tables are low, like in the
winter or the middle of summer, is a possible

indicator of these leaks. We have created a survey to help us collect information from concerned residents living within the Sanitary District. Each survey will be reviewed by staff and, if necessary, be further inspected.

Cross Connection Inspection Program

The Purpose of the Village of Greenville's Cross Connection Control Program, as defined in the local Ordinance §340-26, is to help eliminate possible contamination of the public water distribution and sewage collection systems. As part of this program, an inspection of your facility's internal water system is to be completed. Inspectors will be reviewing your water system for connections that could possibly contaminate the public water distribution system. The Cross Connection Control Program is a DNR mandated program that requires the Village of Greenville to inspect 10% of our residential area each year. This means that your home/ subdivision will be inspected every 10 years regardless of the outcome of your previous inspection or the age of your home.

GREENVILLE FIRST RESPONDERS

Greenville First Responders ended 2020 with 46 calls compared to December 2019 with 35 calls. Rides to the hospital because of Co-vid were as high as it was when the Corona virus first started in early 2020. We ended the year 2020 with 379 calls, down from 413 in 2019. Because of the pandemic, it has been a very busy year for us. However, while on a call and administering aid, we always take extra steps to keep both you and ourselves safe.

This January, we have responded to 42 calls and in February 26; compared to 37 for January and 26 for February 2019. The good news is all of our First Responders have been offered the vaccine from Covid-19 with both inoculation completed.



Online Permit Application System

Greenville has invested in developing a new permitting system, which has an online application component with the ability to pay online. The system was launched in March 2021 and allows the public to apply for building permits (i.e. new house, fence, deck, patio, additions, remodels, etc.), development requests (i.e. rezoning, site plan, plats, special exceptions etc.), and permit types that require work in the public right-of-way (i.e. culvert, driveway, utility etc.). Even if you are not applying for a permit, if you are curious if your neighbor putting up that deck in the backyard has a permit you can check using the online system. Greenville encourages everyone to use this online application system in order to create greater efficiencies and transparency.
