Spring has begun and with it comes the start of construction season. The residents of Greenville will see a number of construction projects around the community this year:

- School Rd. from STH 76 east to Technical Drive will be urbanized. This will include curb, gutter, sidewalks, and on-road bike lanes. This project is tentatively scheduled to begin in May.
- STH 15 bypass construction will continue. Construction on the westbound lane will begin starting April 2023 with a completion date of late fall 2023. The following website has continuing information on the project: <https://projects.511wi.gov/wis15expand/full-project-overview/>
- Village Hall remodel. After many years of studies, the Village will use its allocation from the American Rescue Plan Act funds to finance the remodeling of the Village Hall. The remodel will replace outdated plumbing and mechanicals and move all staff to one side of the building for improved safety and efficiencies. This project will not affect local property taxes since all funding will come from the \$1.2 million of ARPA funding that the Village received. The Village is in the process of finalizing plans and beginning the bidding process.
- Hillview Rd. Sewer and Water Extension. The Village will be extending sewer and water down Hillview Rd. from STH 76 to Hillview Estates. This will allow the new subdivision and existing residents to connect to public sewer and water. This project is expected to begin mid-Summer.

Future Road Projects

- STH 76 and School Rd. roundabout. The State of Wisconsin will be construction a roundabout at the intersection of School Rd. and STH 76. This project is scheduled to begin in 2024.

- Reconstruction of STH 76 from CTH JI to Everglade Rd. The State of Wisconsin will be reconstructing STH 76 from School Rd. to Everglade Rd. This will include curb, gutter, and sidewalks. A roundabout will be constructed at STH 76 and CTH JI during this construction. This project will begin in 2025.

Greenville Property Assessment Information

Property values in Greenville are reviewed and re-assessed annually. Your property's 2023 assessed value will be based on market sales that occurred during in 2022. Sales that occur in after January 1, 2023 will be used to determine assessed values for 2024.

The State of Wisconsin requires all assessed values to be within 10% of market value for the village to be considered in compliance with the law. Assessors review valid arm's length sales to help them determine new assessed values. Before adjusting your assessed value, the assessor breaks down each property by style, location, age, size, and condition.

Your assessment will most likely change every year depending on market conditions. If assessors did not revalue property annually, your neighbor may sell their house for more than its assessed value. That home's value should now reflect a much higher value than its current assessment. Sales like this create inequities in the amount of taxes paid by everyone in Greenville.

Annual property assessments ensure that as market values change, your assessed value will change to match. Therefore, if similar homes increase by 12% in one year your value will also increase by 12% to mirror what the market is garnering. However, this does not mean that more taxes can be collected. In fact, the overall assessed value of the community cannot be used in determining budgets for the year.

Different neighborhoods in the village appreciate and depreciate at different rates. Assessors are required to follow state law when valuing property in the village. Changing assessed values annually maintains fair and equitable values and creates uniformity for all properties.

Greenville also re-assesses property annually to allow for smaller changes in value each year, instead of large increases/decreases every 3 to 5 years. For example, had we not revalued property the last 4 years the average property in our village would be increased by about 40% instead of 8% to 12% each year.

A notice of new value will be mailed to you in late April, 2023. You will have an opportunity to set an appointment online and speak with an assessor at your convenience before the Board of Review. Open Book will start the day you get your notice all the way through June 7, 2023. Below is the timeline for this year's Open Book and Board of Review.

Hydrant Flushing

Greenville Utility will be flushing and exercising hydrants beginning in May. This process typically takes approximately two months.

The Public Service Commission and Wisconsin DNR requires the Utility to flush the water distribution system, including the fire hydrants. Flushing hydrants is essential to keep your water safe and maintaining the distribution system. This also helps to ensure that hydrants are in good working order for the Fire Department's use.

During this process, you might notice that your water appears cloudy and rusty. This is normal and you can still drink the water. If you run the cold water tap that is located closest to your water meter, this will help to clear the water up. If you have questions, you can contact the Public Works Office at (920)757-7276.

Cross Connection Inspection Program

The purpose of the Village of Greenville's Cross Connection Control Program, as defined in the local Ordinance 5340-26, is to help eliminate possible contamination of the public water distribution and sewage collection systems. As part of this program, an inspection of your facility's internal water system is to be completed. Inspectors will be reviewing your water system for connections that could possibly contaminate the public water distribution and water collection system. The Cross Connection Control Program is a DNR mandated program that requires the Village of Greenville to inspect a percentage of Village homes each year. Residents who receive notice will be able to schedule their appointment online. This year's inspections will also include an exchange of the home water meter.



Good Dog, Good Owner

You can be a responsible pet owner and protect our waters.

Your dog brings a lot of joy to your life. Enjoying your four-legged friend doesn't need to come at the price of clean water. We can have both. But to make it happen, we all need to think a little differently.

Pet waste is not only an unpleasant find on a yard or sidewalk, it carries bacteria that causes beach closings in the summer. Campylobacteriosis and salmonellosis are often the cause of the "24-hour bug". They're transferred through fecal material from an infected person or animal. Toxoplasmosis is carried by a single-cell parasite that lives in infected animal feces (typically cats). In pregnant women, it can pass through the umbilical cord to the unborn fetus, causing serious abnormalities.

What can you do?

Prevent bacteria in our streams by carrying small plastic bags when walking your dog. Collect droppings, tie a knot in the bag, and dispose of it properly. Do not throw pet waste down the sewer. At home, pick up pet waste often. Even waste in your backyard can pollute local waterways. You can flush the waste down the toilet, put it in your trash can (be sure to check your local ordinances first!) or bury it in your yard.



What is Stormwater?

Stormwater is rain or snowmelt and water from things people do, like overwatering the lawn or discharging pool water into the street drain. We can choose products carefully and shape our lawns and pavement so water sinks in. When we do, runoff is reduced, pollutants filter out and streams and groundwater are protected.

Untreated runoff is the biggest threat to our nation's water quality, according to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Let's make the small, important changes that will reduce that threat and improve water quality and our lives!

Free Tire Drop-Off

Spring Dates: Wednesday, April 12 – Thursday, April 20, 2023

Fall Dates: Wednesday, September 13 – Thursday, September 21, 2023

Location: Greenville Yard Waste Site – W8031 School Road, Greenville

Collection is limited to 4 tires per household. Tires will not be accepted at the Village during any other time, however can be dropped at the Outagamie County Landfill for a fee. Tires from businesses are not accepted. Only tires with a rim size of 20" or less will be accepted at no charge. For all tires with a rim size of 21" or larger in size or quantities of over 4, the resident will be charged \$12.00 per tire at the Village of Greenville Municipal Building; or \$425.00 per ton if taken directly to the Outagamie County Landfill/Recycling Center (1419 Holland Road, Appleton).

Yard Waste Site

Residents wishing to use the Village of Greenville Yard Waste Site will need to purchase an access card for \$5 and pay the annual fee of \$40 prior to using the site. Residents who have not paid will not be able to access the site. One card allowed per household. The card should be kept from year to year as it is renewable. Programming on the card is good for one calendar year (January 1- December 31). The Village of Greenville does not offer a prorated charge based on date of purchase. Replacement card cost is \$5. Residents should review the full Yard Waste Site Operations Policy prior to using the site.

Brush Pick-Up Changes

The Public Works Department will begin curbside brush pickup on the second Monday of every month, or as weather and operations allow. Effective March 14, 2022 the fee to be added to the brush pick-up list is \$50. In addition to the fees, residents must provide their name, phone number and the address of the pickup location. Residents requesting pickup must stop at the Municipal Service Complex no later than 12:00pm on the Friday prior to pickup to be placed on that month's brush pick up list. Brush will NOT be picked up at any address that has not paid to be added to the list. Overage fees will be applied to any stop requiring more than 20 minutes of chipping.

Programs and Recreation

Greenville offers several programs and opportunities for residents to get involved and interact with their community. - Family Night Events: Admissions are FREE and events will go on rain or shine! Events begin at 6:30pm and include a family friendly, interactive activity, food truck, outdoor movie, concessions and much more! Keep an eye on our social media for more information.
- Tennis Lessons: Lessons are held twice a week for six weeks at Jennerjohn Park and are taught by qualified instructors, based on the United States Professional Tennis Registry standard of teaching.

- Motorized vehicles are not allowed on the trails. This includes cars, four wheelers, motorized scooters or any other device powered by an electric or gas motor.

Street Tree Planting and Pruning

Subdivisions with curb and gutter, and lots with lawns already installed, will start to see shade trees being planted in the spring. Property owners that are scheduled for planting will receive a letter and care instructions prior to planting. Proper care in the first few years after planting is very important for the establishment and health of the trees.

Village staff and ISA Certified Arborists from Fox Valley Tree Care and Landscape will be performing tree pruning services on Village street trees during the coming months. The purpose of the pruning that is performed depends on the size, age and species of the trees. We maintain an inventory of all public trees. Young, developing trees are pruned on a three year cycle while we aim to prune the older, more mature trees on a six year cycle. There is no cost to the property owner for this work and not all trees will be pruned.

Greenville now has four Outagamie County Sheriff Deputies dedicated to serving and protecting our residents. They have a big job to do as their services cover all of Greenville, including assisting when needed at the airport. In the year of 2022, the Sheriff's Deputies reported to a total of 9,060 calls. To break that down, each Sheriff Deputy would have responded to 2,265 calls per year and 188.75 calls per month. With that said, there is a total of about 25 incidents per day that require their assistance in Greenville. Many times, Village Hall receives calls from residents that our employees don't or can't handle. If you are dealing with an emergency, please dial 911. If you are dealing with other instances that an officer may have to be involved in, such as noise complaints or perceived ordinance violations etc. please call your Outagamie County non-emergency number at (920) 832-5000 for assistance.
