PUBLIC TEST/RETAB OF VOTING TABULATORS

Each election a Public Test of the voting tabulators used during Early Voting and Election Day is held prior to the beginning of Early Voting. The Public Test is an extensive, transparent and bi-partisan process. It helps to ensure the public can have absolute confidence in the voting results. Before any voting equipment may be utilized in any election, it first must be certified by both the Federal and State government. This certification process involves months of rigorous testing at both levels.

Staff from the Grundy County Clerk's Office and Governmental Business Systems, the County's election vendor, conducts the Public Test. Representatives from both political parties, State's Attorney's Office, the press, the Illinois State Board of Elections, and members of the public are invited to attend. Notices are published, posted on website, and sent to those involved parties.

Prior to the Public Test, the County Clerk's election team and vendor, conducted internal Logic and Accuracy (L&A) tests on every tabulator. Every single piece of equipment used for Early Voting and Election Day is tested to ensure they function with precision and accurately tabulate ballots. Representatives from both political parties compared the tapes from those L&A tests against the precinct tapes that are run during the Public Test. The Public Test is an opportunity for interested parties to observe this process. For the Public Test, tabulators are selected to test for each office on the ballot.

Once L&A testing and the Public Test are conducted, all election equipment is locked and sealed with tamper proof security seals. These seal numbers are logged and checked by election judges upon opening the polls on Election Day.

On the 15th day after each election, at 10:00 a.m. the ReTab/Canvass will be conducted in the Grundy County Clerk's Office. The Illinois State Board of Elections randomly selects 5% of election precincts, as well as one Early Voting tabulator, in every jurisdiction. The ballots from those precincts or Early Voting location, are retabulated and compared to Election Day results.

The ReTab is another way to ensure voters that the tabulation system is counting ballots correctly. Representatives from both political parties, State's Attorney's Office, the press, the Illinois State Board of Elections, and members of the public are invited to attend.

The Public Test is required under Section 10 ILCS 5/24B-9 of the Illinois Election Code. The ReTab is required under Section 10 ILCS 5/24B-15 of the Illinois Election Code.



Voter Registration Cards list your Township, Precinct, Polling Place and the units of government for which you are entitled to vote. You are NOT required by Illinois Law to present your Voter Registration Card in order to vote on Election Day. Your Voter Registration Card is also a valid form of I.D.



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When and how are Vote by Mail, Grace Period and Early Voting ballots counted?

Early Voting & Grace Period ballots are tabulated Election Night, after the polls close, and are included in the Election Night Results.

Vote by Mail ballots received by Election Day are processed by the Vote by Mail Judges, from each political party, prior to (if needed) and on Election Day.

Vote by Mail ballots received after Election Day must be postmarked by midnight Election Day and received in the County Clerk's Office by April 15th. These ballots are processed by Vote by Mail Judges, from each political party. These results will be added to the Unofficial Election Results and will be made Official at that time.

VOTE BY MAIL IS A SAFE AND SECURE WAY TO VOTE. How is your vote by mail ballot processed?

- Complete and return a Vote by Mail application.
- The Clerk's Office verifies the voter's information and enters the returned Vote by Mail application into the voter registration system.
- The Vote by Mail ballot packet is mailed to you with detailed instructions.
- Vote your ballot when you are prepared, insert it into the signed certification envelope and return it in the provided postage paid mailing envelope.
- Once the ballot is received, the Clerk's Office logs the returned envelope in the voter registration system and the system prohibits that voter from requesting another Vote by Mail ballot or from voting in-person, Early or on Election Day.
- All Vote by Mail ballots are kept sealed, in a secured location.
- Teams of three Vote by Mail processing judges, represented by each political party, work together to open the sealed envelopes and verify the voters' signature on the certification envelopes. The Vote by Mail judges then process the verified ballots into the Verity Scan.
- Vote by Mail processing takes place on Election Day and, if needed, on prior dates. Vote by Mail processing dates and times are posted on the County Clerk's website and is open to the public.
- After the polls close on Election Day, the Vote by Mail ballots are then tabulated. These results are included in the Election Night results.
- Any valid, late arriving, Vote by Mail ballots, postmarked by Election Day and received in the Clerk's Office by April 15, 2025 are processed by the Vote by Mail processing judges. These results are then added to the final vote totals during the Canvass, on April 16, 2025. Election results are certified at that time.

ELECTION FACTS

<u>Let's talk about . . .</u> <u>ELECTION SECURITY!</u>

The growing threat of cybercrime has been on the minds of many voters. Recently, there have been many questions about the security of the voter data under the care of the election authorities. The Grundy County Clerk's Office is committed to cybersecurity and the physical security of all our election data.

There have been many questions and stories about how secure our elections are and if our elections can be hacked. Unfortunately, there has also been much mis-information spread to deliberately undermine the voter's confidence in our elections.

Here are facts regarding our election security:

- NONE of the voting equipment in Grundy County is ever connected to the Internet, either in the polling place or in the Clerk's Office, when votes are being tabulated, or results are being processed, meaning they cannot be hacked.
- All voting machines are locked and sealed with numbered security seals, to prevent any type of tampering or system interference. The memory used with the machines only stores election information. No voter information is on the memory.
- All ballots cast have a 100% verified paper trail. Grundy County's Verity Voting system, is a trusted and proven process, the perfect paper trail with no votes encoded into barcodes, no segregated ballots, redundant storage and completely auditable results. We use a paper ballot, so there is always a back-up. Additionally, once the voting period concludes, Grundy County maintains all records for audit or recount for a set period as required by the State of Illinois.
- All voting machines are put through logic and accuracy testing before every election. This testing is completed with a test deck of ballots being voted on the machines, then tabulated to ensure the machines are tabulating and recording the votes accurately. The public is invited to observe the Public Test.
- Before the polls open on Election Day, Election Judges confirm that there are zero votes cast at the opening of the polls. They also compare the number of ballots cast to the number of voters processed throughout the day, making sure the vote count to number of voters balance.
- On Election Day, while the polls are open, the Election Judges periodically inspect the equipment and security seals to ensure no tampering has occurred.
- Poll Watchers are allowed to observe Early Voting and Election Day polling locations. They must follow the State of Illinois Poll watcher guidelines and must surrender their Poll watcher credentials to the Election Judges at the polling location.
- After the polls close, two Election Judges, one from each political party, together, return all equipment, ballots and supplies from their polling location to the Courthouse.
- After the Election, a re-tabulation of selected precincts by the Illinois State Board of Elections is completed to ensure that the reported results match the ballots cast, and that these results match the results from Election night. The public is invited to attend the Re-Tab/Canvass.
- Grundy County is committed to ensuring that every vote is counted and counted correctly. The County Clerk's Office has taken cybersecurity seriously and has taken numerous steps to enhance all security processes and will continue this effort.

As the election authority for Grundy County, nothing is as important as ensuring that voters have faith and confidence in the security of our elections, knowing that their votes are accurately counted and the integrity of the process will be protected.

Voters are encouraged to call or go directly to the County Clerk's Office, or to the County Clerk's website and verified social media pages to ensure voters are getting accurate election information.

Election Results are not official until after the ReTab/Canvass. The Re-Tab of the randomly selected precincts and Early Voting equipment chosen by the State Board of Elections, will be conducted April 15th. The Canvass will be conducted April 16th at 10 a.m., where the final ballot count will include any remaining Vote by Mail ballots received and postmarked by Election Day, any valid Provisional and late arriving Military/Overseas ballots to be added to the count. The Re-Tab and Canvass are open to the public.

ELECTION FACTS

Let's talk about . . . Vote by Mail Myths!

MYTH: I have to vote by mail this election.

FACT: Voters will only be mailed a ballot, if they sign and return a Vote by Mail application. If the voter wishes to vote in-person, either at an Early Voting site, or on Election Day at their polling place they may do so. Vote by Mail is only an option! Illinois voters also now have the option to apply to be placed on the Permanent Vote by Mail list, please complete and mail the application from our website: www.grundycountyil.gov.

MYTH: If a vote by mail application is sent to a deceased individual or a voter who no longer resides at that address, the mail ballot can be fraudulently voted.

FACT: Only an application is being mailed, not a ballot. If a ballot did get mailed to someone who is deceased or no longer lives at that address, each mail ballot must be returned in an authorized ballot return envelope and must be enclosed in a signed certification envelope. This signature is compared to the signature on file at the County Clerk's Office for the voter by Ballot Processing judges, from both political parties. If the signature does not match, the ballot is rejected.

MYTH: There are fewer safeguards in place for voting by mail, compared to voting in-person.

FACT: There are multiple safeguards in place no matter which voting method is used. Vote by Mail ballots must have a signed ballot certification. This signature is confirmed by Ballot Processing Judges. Signature comparison is also used for verification for in-person voting, meaning the same safeguards are used for voting by mail and in-person voting.

MYTH: If I apply and get mailed a ballot, I won't be allowed to vote at my polling place.

FACT: If a ballot is mailed to a voter and they either choose to not return it or if the ballot has not been received back to the County Clerk's Office, the voter may still vote at their polling place. They either need to surrender the unused mail ballot to the Election Judges or they may vote by affidavit, stating they did not receive and/or use the mail ballot that was sent to them. If the mail ballot is received after the voter votes in-person, the system would not allow it to be counted.

MYTH: Vote by Mail makes it easy for a person to vote more than once in the same election.

FACT: Once a voter applies for a vote by mail ballot and the ballot envelope is returned, it is entered as returned into the voter registration system. If a voter tried mailing a second ballot, or tried to vote in-person, the system would not allow it as that voter would already be marked as "Voted".

MYTH: Vote by Mail ballots can be intercepted, and anyone could vote someone else's ballot.

FACT: Voter validation is key, and the signature verification is the best and required practice. This means every ballot returned is enclosed in a signed and sealed ballot certification envelope. Ballot Processing Judges, from each political party, work in teams of three to verify voters' signatures. The voters' signatures on the ballot certification envelope are compared and verified to the voters' signatures on the vote by mail application, and also on that voter's registration file. If all three judges agree the signature does not match, the ballot is rejected and the voter is notified within two days and is given a chance to rectify the issue and validate their identity, if needed. This period extends to 14 days after Election Day, in order to allow all votes to be counted. Also, if a voter does not receive their ballot, or loses it, they may simply contact their local election office for a replacement. Most importantly, stealing a mail ballot is a crime, and punishable by law.

MYTH: Once I mail my ballot, someone could tamper with it before it is delivered.

FACT: Any ballot delivered to the County Clerk's Office that is open, or has been opened and resealed, is automatically rejected by the Ballot Processing judges. If rejected, the voter is notified and has a chance to review the ballot and confirm it is theirs, and it would then be counted. You are also able to return your Vote by Mail ballot directly to the Grundy County Courthouse or utilize the Ballot Drop Box, which is under 24-hour surveillance.
