A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT EXTENSION FOR INDIGENOUS PROGRAMMING CONSULTING SERVICES, AND A RELATED BUDGET TRANSFER

WHEREAS, the Common Council acknowledges the City of Hudson’s location on the ancestral homelands of Native peoples who, due to forced removal, currently reside in locations across the continent; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council recognizes the importance of education surrounding the Indigenous history and present of the region including and surrounding the City of Hudson; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council previously recognized and designated May 5 as the National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Native Women and Girls in the City of Hudson; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council previously authorized the retention of local consultant Heather Bruegl to arrange cultural and educational programming honoring Indigenous People’s Day and Native American Heritage Month, resulting in a successful series of seven events engaging residents with the work and perspectives of Native luminaries from across the diaspora during October and November 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor’s Office and the Common Council wishes to continue the City’s relationship with Ms. Bruegl to:

- (1) engage in further research and public engagement regarding the renaming of the Henry Hudson Waterfront Park,
- (2) work with City officials to develop a municipal land acknowledgment and publication plan, and
- (3) organize programming for the May 5, 2023 National Day of Awareness for MMIP (Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons).

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Hudson Common Council authorizes and directs the Mayor to enter into an agreement extension with consultant Heather Bruegl for the continued provision of Indigenous programming consulting services, a copy of which is appended to this resolution, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Common Council authorizes and directs the City Treasurer to make the following budget amendment to the fiscal year 2023 budget:

1. Work and research on renaming the Waterfront Park and municipal Land Acknowledgement for Hudson
