


About the City of Hudson Legal Committee Redistricting Exercise

- Pursuant to the census block data from the United States Census
 Bureau from the 2020 census, as adjusted by the New York Legislative
 Task Force on Demographic Research and Reapportionment with
 respect to persons resident in state or federal prisons, the population
 of the residents of the five wards of the City of Hudson is not in
 compliance with the Constitution of the United States because the
 deviation between the population of the most populated ward (the
 First Ward with a population of 1233) is more than 10% above that of
 the population of the least populated ward (the Fifth Ward with a
 population of 1158), such deviation being approximately 12.8%.
- The Legal Committee of the City of Hudson Common Council has made recommendations to the Common Council on how the wards of the City of Hudson should be drawn to be compliant.
- The following document lays out the process and includes links to requisite files and programs that can assist any Citizen of Hudson recreate the recommended results to be with a nearly 5% deviation as asked by the Hudson City Democratic Committee.

Tools used


- To create a viable map that better details the streets of Hudson and show the proposed new ward boundaries, the Legal Committee used <u>District Builder</u>.
- District Builder's software gives you access to the same block-level data used in legal redistricting plans for free. This means we have been able to create an electoral map that better reflect our local communities and leads to fairer representation.
- District Builder also allowed for the use of a geojson file for an address overlay. The free file is available for download on the <u>New York GIS website</u>.
- The Legal Committee also reached out to District Builder and confirmed that the platform leverages the 2020 U.S. Census data and for New York also uses the updated prisoner-adjusted data.





How can we get close to 5% Deviation

- District Builder yielded the ability to create a map that clearly shows the proposed street boundaries of each ward (see following slides).
- The Districts in the accompanying table (right) are representative of Hudson's five wards and provide a population breakdown per ward.
- As of the 2020 census, Hudson reports a total population of 5,894 – the selected districts yield 5,857 to account for prisoner count.
- Dividing the total population by five (5) wards yields a district ideal population: of 1,179.
- When accounting for a 10% total deviation would mean 118 people variance between districts (the most populated district cannot be more than 118 people greater than the least population district)
- Using the 5% (above and below) deviation rule, no district can be more than 59 people greater than or less than the ideal population. This provides a range for all wards to be between 1,238 persons and 1120 persons.








2022 Proposed Ward Boundaries




Proposed 1st Ward




Proposed 2nd Ward




Proposed 3rd Ward



Proposed 4th Ward





Proposed 5th Ward



Competitiveness

A competitiveness metric evaluates the plan based on the average partisan lean of each district, calculated using the Partisan Voting Index (PVI). A partisan lean of the district plan which deviates from the overall lean of the state can be indicative of gerrymandering.






Majority-Minority

A majority-minority district is a district in which a racial minority group or groups comprise a majority of the district's total population. The display indicates districts where a minority race has a simple majority (Black, Hispanic, etc.), or where the sum of multiple minority races combine to a majority (called "Coalition" districts).

Your map has 1 Majority-Minority districts




