The 2nd annual LatinX Parade and Festival will occur on Saturday, September 17, 2022. We will begin a Parade from 7th Street park down Warren Street to the Henry Hudson Riverfront Park. Spectators will be able to pull up chairs to enjoy the Parade. We will have participants holding and representing their country's flags, wearing traditional attire, dancing, and singing to their national anthems.

Upon arrival at the waterfront, community members will be greeted by food trucks, artist vendors, and music. Attendees will be able to partake in activities including face painting, bouncy house, local LatinX restaurants, food vendors, and local vendors selling merchandise. Our event sponsors and partner organizations will have tables with informative information regarding programs and upcoming events and opportunities. CCSM will have a table at each entrance where we will be informing and empowering our community members about their rights when dealing with ICE.

Given that we have more time to plan and advertise the festival this year, we will be able to expand our geographic reach in turnout for the event. Advertisement will begin with the ad required for the Affidavit of Publication. We will host radio and print ads in La Voz for two months starting mid-July and conduct radio interviews with local media before this event. We will also advertise through social media to reach the general public. Samples from last year are attached.

Although it may seem as if COVID-19 is slowing down, Columbia County Sanctuary Movement will still have COVID safety in mind. We will have a team of volunteers who pass out face masks and hand sanitizers. We will also place a sanitation table at each entrance to the riverfront and several throughout the festival, including masks, hand sanitizer,, and signs about COVID safety. We are encouraging vendors to use reusable and recyclable materials as we want to be mindful of our impact on the environment. There will be a team regularly picking up litter throughout the event.

2) Purpose of Project (attach extra sheet(s) if necessary):

The underlying principle that shapes and drives all the work that Columbia County Sanctuary Movement does is our sense of community. We stand on these fundamentals: accepting others for who they are and what they contribute to society, whether through their art, music, food cultivation abilities, and specialized professions. We believe that everyone brings something to the table regardless of social, immigration, racial or sexual identity.

Similar to last year, we chose September 17th for the event as the first weekend of Hispanic Heritage Month. Additionally, many Latin countries celebrate their independence days during this month.

The main objective of the 2nd Annual LatinX Parade and Festival is to celebrate an array of diverse cultures, where friends, family, and fellow neighbors can raise their country's flag with pride and without fear of judgment or criminal prosecution. The Parade and Festival represent decades of aspirations for the local Latinx community to be seen, heard, and appreciated, and to celebrate all they have contributed to our city and culture. This event embodies community building: we will gather local businesses, artists, organizations, and community members along Hudson's waterfront for one day. The event features local Latinx-owned companies and food vendors, Latinx performers, musicians, artists, and community organizations that enrich our city in a family-friendly, safe, fun community day.

We felt welcomed last year as we paraded down Warren street. Allies lined the streets, cheering for each country as it passed. Patrons of businesses unaware of the event took photos and waved as we passed. One Puerto Rican diner saw the Puerto Rican group march by and jumped in to join the parade, excited to be included.

This is an opportunity for our Latinx community to celebrate their roots and pride in their home countries being afar. We heard from last year's attendees that even though they hadn't been to their home countries in a long time, the festival allowed community members to celebrate and feel like they were celebrating as they would in their home countries with their community.

The event also bolstered Latinx-owned businesses. Last year's festival allowed a community member to receive vendor approval for the first time. Before debuting their small business at The Festival, they began getting discouraged, as most often do when starting a new business. He considered backing out, but CCSM supported him in getting ready. The Festival proved to be lucrative for him, and it helped spread the word about his culinary capabilities. He officially launched his business shortly after. One artist who sold his art at the event also informed CCSM that his success at the festival and the revenue it generated was enough to plan an official launch of his small business. These are only a couple of stories out of several that prove how powerful The LatinX Parade and Festival has become in such a short period. We want to use our platform to give community members the skills to apply for vendor permits and whatever else they may need on their road to success and financial freedom. Our objective in hosting the area's 2nd Latinx Parade and Festival is to break down barriers, educate community members on the programs and resources that CCSM, our allies, and the City of Hudson have to offer and bring tourism and economic growth to the City of Hudson.

3) Why Project should be funded from City of Hudson Tourism Budget?:

Throughout the years, Hudson has proved to be a blended city, housing those from all different walks of life. This beautiful blend is what allowed Hudson to become a Sanctuary City. It brought the community together to fight for Black Lives Matter and LGBTQ rights. It brought a community together during a global crisis to give what was already stretched thin to their neighbors, whom they knew had even less. When asked about the Latinx Parade and Festival, a resident living in Hudson for several years stated, "This is the most people of color I've ever seen together in one place since moving to Hudson." Hearing this from several others motivated us to recommit to hosting a 2nd LatinX Parade and Festival and other events that would showcase and celebrate the diverse backgrounds within the city of Hudson, NY. The Hudson we all envision is one where everyone from different cultures and backgrounds has a voice and representation. The LatinX Parade and Festival allows us to continue to do so.

This event will bring the Latinx and broader community together to honor the history and contributions of Latinx people to our city and society. The festival will help build bridges between communities and create a stronger sense of ownership and belonging to the City of Hudson. The festival will help honor the history of African and Indigenous lineages that feed Latinx

histories and identities from colonialism to the present. In hosting the area's 2nd LatinX Parade,, we would like to continue to make this event a place that brings folks from all over to enjoy LatinX culture, and all that Hudson has to offer.

4) How Project will benefit the City of Hudson and Tourism?:

In Collaboration with the Hudson Tourism Board, we organized the area's First LatinX Parade in September of 2021, which was well-received by the general public. This event brought over 1,000 people in attendance, which was higher than initially anticipated. The Latinx Festival will economically benefit our community by supporting small Latinx businesses, musicians, and artists. Visiting daytrippers will learn more about what attractions we offer in Hudson and have a unique experience at the festival, encouraging them to see the city further. Attendees last year were primarily day-trippers and intra-city tourists from Columbia County, Greene County, Rensselaer County, Albany County, Dutchess County, Washington County, Ulster County, Rochester County, and Westchester County. Day-trippers and potential overnight visitors from multiple counties in New York City, Western Massachusetts, and Rhode Island. We hope that continuing the LatinX Parade and Festival would give Hudson the platform it needs to become the go-to place for fun activities, food, and entertainment for the entire family in the Hudson Valley and Capital District.
