## Fatal Traffic Collision – Newland Street and Yorktown Avenue

On Monday, March 7, 2022, at approximately 8:15 a.m., the Huntington Beach Police Department (HBPD) responded to a traffic collision at the intersection of Newland Street and Yorktown Avenue, involving a white 1990 Ford F-250 and a white 2018 Chevrolet Silverado belonging to the City of Huntington Beach.

Upon arrival, officers located two male teenage occupants inside the F-250. Both occupants were transferred to local hospitals. The first teenage male unfortunately succumbed to his injuries. The second teenage male remains in the hospital in critical condition. The driver of the Silverado, a 38-year old male, was uninjured.

At this point, investigators are still looking into the circumstances of the collision. It does not appear that drugs or alcohol were a factor in the collision. Since a City of Huntington Beach vehicle was involved in the collision, the Irvine Police Department will be taking the lead on the investigation.

“I am so sorry to hear about the tragic traffic collision that took place this morning,” said Huntington Beach Mayor, Barbara Delgleize. “On behalf of myself and the City Council, we wish to extend our sincerest condolences to the families impacted by this terrible accident.”
