




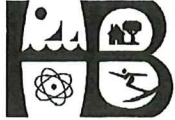

**Per Elections Code section 15: Notwithstanding any other provision of law, if the last day for the performance of any act provided for or required by this code shall be a holiday, the act may be performed upon the next business day. Gov't Code Section 6700 states: Saturdays are holidays only after 12:00 p.m. The express language of Elections Code Section 15 refers to the "last day," meaning the whole day must be a holiday in order for the extension to apply. Since the deadline is a Saturday (a half-day), it is not considered a holiday. Therefore, there is no extension of time to the following Monday.*
