CURRENT RULES

RULES OF THE DEMOCRATIC CAUCUS OF THE INGHAM COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

As Amended November 14, 2023

- 1. The Democratic Caucus of the Ingham County Board of Commissioners meets in November or December each year and selects, by a majority vote of Democratic Commissioners, its nominees for Board of Commissioners leadership for the following year. This process can also be initiated during any meeting of the Democratic Caucus by a two-thirds vote of Democratic Caucus members currently serving.
- 2. The Democratic Caucus will select, by a majority vote of Democratic Caucus members elected or appointed to serve during the following year, its nominees for Chairperson of the Board of Commissioners and Vice Chairperson of the Board of Commissioners. The Caucus shall also select, by a majority vote of those elected or serving the following year, a Caucus Chairperson, a Caucus Vice Chairperson and a Caucus Treasurer.
- 3. Each Democratic Commissioner in order of seniority from most to least, chooses one Standing Committee to serve on. After each Democratic Commissioner has made one selection, each makes a second selection in order of seniority, providing that:
 - a. No Standing Committee shall include more than the allocated number of Democrats, given the proportion of Democratic Commissioners on the entire Board. Seniority shall be determined by the total number of years and months having served on the Board, whether continuous or interrupted service.
 - b. Where Commissioners have equal seniority, the selection order shall be alphabetical for the first year following election and reverse alphabetical for the second year.
 - c. The Board Chairperson and Vice Chairperson shall not serve on the same liaison committees.
- 4. Selection of Standing Committee Chairs. Using the order of seniority as defined above, a Democratic Commissioner may choose to chair a Standing Committee, providing that:
 - a. Each Standing Committee shall have only one Chair.
 - b. The Board Chairperson and Vice Chairperson are ineligible to chair Committees.
 - c. Standing Committee Chairs must have at least two year's experience on the Board and have served at least one year on the Committee they chair, provided however, that a person having chaired the Board for at least one year will be considered to have had at least one year's experience on each Standing Committee.
 - d. Commissioners chairing a Standing Committee during the previous year shall be ineligible to chair a Standing Committee during the succeeding year unless chair vacancies remain after all eligible Democratic Commissioners have exercised their option to chair Standing Committee.
 - e. If no Democratic Commissioner who did not chair a committee during the previous year is available and willing to chair a given committee, the first-term Democratic Members

will be given the opportunity to elect to chair it, provided they will have had at least one full year's experience serving on that committee.

- f. The Vice-Chair of the Board will chair Caucus in the absence of the Caucus Chair.
- 5. The Chairperson-elect agrees to appoint Standing Committee membership and chairs as selected by the Democratic Caucus at the first Board meeting in January and appoints remaining committee members after receiving recommendations from the Republican Caucus. The Board Chairperson shall appoint Vice-Chairs of Standing Committees.
- 6. The Democratic Caucus discusses and by vote of a majority of its membership recommends Commissioner appointments and liaisons to Special Committees, Boards, Commissions, etc., giving major consideration to the wishes of individual Commissioners. The Board Chairperson agrees to follow these recommendations in making appointments.
- 7. The Democratic Caucus will meet as needed (other than before Board meetings) to discuss substantive issues. The Democratic Caucus does not require its members to conform to a Caucus position on substantive issues, but only on matters of appointment and related procedural votes. A Commissioner may be given leave by the majority of the membership of the caucus to oppose an appointment if approved at a meeting of the caucus.
- 8. Caucus Participation. The Democratic Caucus will be open to all Democratic Commissioners who agree to support Caucus selections for leadership and committee positions, agree to support Caucus recommendations for citizen board appointments (unless the caucus grants leave to oppose) and agree to participate in good faith in Caucus discussions.

PROPOSED RULES

RULES OF THE DEMOCRATIC CAUCUS OF THE INGHAM COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS As Amended November 14, 2023

- 1. The Democratic Caucus of the Ingham County Board of Commissioners meets in November or December each year and selects, by a majority vote of Democratic Commissioners, its nominees for Board of Commissioners leadership for the following year. This process can also be initiated during any meeting of the Democratic Caucus by a two-thirds vote of Democratic Caucus members currently serving.
- 2. The Democratic Caucus will select, by a majority vote of Democratic Caucus members elected or appointed to serve during the following year, its nominees for Chairperson of the Board of Commissioners and Vice Chairperson of the Board of Commissioners. The Caucus shall also select, by a majority vote of those elected or serving the following year, a Caucus Chairperson, a Caucus Vice Chairperson and a Caucus Treasurer.
- 3. Each Democratic Commissioner Caucus Member, in order of seniority from most to least, chooses one Standing Committee to serve on. After each Democratic Commissioner Caucus Member has made one selection, each will make makes a second selection in order of seniority, providing that:
 - a. No Standing Committee shall include more than the allocated number of Democrats, given **Democratic Caucus members, which will depend** on the **proportion of Democratic Commissioners on the** entire Board.
 - b. Seniority shall be determined by the total number of years and months having served on the Board, whether continuous or interrupted service. Where Commissioners have equal seniority, the selection order shall be alphabetical for the first year following election and reverse alphabetical for the second year.
 - c. The Board Chairperson and Vice Chairperson shall not serve on the same liaison committees.—The Vice Chairperson of the Board of Commissioners shall be ineligible to serve on any Standing Committee to which the Chairperson of the Board of Commissioners has been appointed.
- 4. Selection of Standing Committee Chairs. Using the order of seniority as defined above, a Democratic Commissioner may choose to chair a Standing Committee, providing that:
 - a. Each Standing Committee shall have only one Chair.
 - b. The Board Chairperson and Vice Chairperson are ineligible to chair Committees.
 - c. Standing Committee Chairs must have at least two year's experience on the Board and have served at least one year on the Committee they chair, provided, however, that a person having chaired the Board for at least one year will be considered to have had at least one year's experience on each Standing Committee.

- d. Commissioners chairing a Standing Committee during the previous year shall be ineligible to chair a Standing Committee during the succeeding year unless chair vacancies remain after all eligible Democratic Commissioners have exercised their option to chair Standing Committee.
- e. If no Democratic Commissioner who did not chair a committee during the previous year is available and willing to chair a given committee, the first-term Democratic **Caucus** Members will be given the opportunity to elect to chair it, provided they will have had at least one full year's experience serving on that committee.

f. The Vice-Chair of the Board will chair the Caucus in the absence of the Caucus Chair.

- 5. The Chairperson-elect agrees to appoint Standing Committee membership and chairs as selected by the Democratic Caucus at the first Board of **Commissioners** meeting in January and appoints remaining committee members after receiving recommendations from the Republican Caucus. The Board Chairperson shall appoint Vice-Chairs of Standing Committees, on the advice of each Standing Committee Chair.
- 6. The Democratic Caucus will discuss discusses, and by a vote of a majority of its membership, recommends-Commissioner appointments and liaisons to Special Committees, Boards, Commissions, etc., giving major primary consideration to the wishes of individual Commissioners Democratic Caucus Members, with opportunities offered based on order of seniority. The Board Chairperson agrees to follow these recommendations in making appointments.
- 7. The Democratic Caucus will meet as needed (other than before Board meetings) to discuss substantive issues. The Democratic Caucus does not require its members to conform to a Caucus position on substantive issues, but only on matters of appointment and related procedural votes. A Commissioner may be given leave by the majority of the membership of the caucus to oppose an appointment if approved at a meeting of the caucus. a simple majority of the Caucus in attendance at the Caucus meeting immediately prior to the Board of Commissioners meeting in which the appointment is to be considered.
- 8. Caucus Participation. The Democratic Caucus will be open to all Democratic Commissioners who agree to support Caucus selections for leadership and committee positions, agree to support Caucus recommendations for citizen board appointments (unless the caucus grants leave to oppose) and agree to participate in good faith in Caucus discussions. The Democratic Caucus may remove any member by a two-thirds vote of Caucus members serving.
