North Plains' Vision Statement for the future of our community reads, "In the year 2035, residents of North Plains enjoy a safe and welcoming community as a livable place for people of all ages. North Plains is an independent community within Washington County that maintains a small-town character while accommodating current and future residents. Citizen participation is strong and community members can see the results of their involvement. Community gathering places and events form the heart of North Plains."

I have worked in the financial industry for over 24 years and helping people plan ahead for retirement is something that I enjoy. **Why am I sharing this and how does this relate to an urban growth boundary (UGB) expansion?** Well, every Oregon city has a UGB which is basically a line drawn on planning maps to designate where a city is planning to grow 20 years into the future. The State of Oregon land use laws require cities to plan ahead for a 20-year period and follow a process to plan what their communities will look like by that time. Those laws require a city to study both employment needs and housing needs. If you want to retire comfortably, you need to plan ahead. If a community wants smart growth, they also need to plan ahead.

Expanding a UGB for a city can have several potential reasons and benefits. While there are many opinions on what that might mean for a city, most strategic plans include balancing economic development, environmental sustainability, quality of life and infrastructure demands to make those informed decisions that benefit the community as a whole.

North Plains has experienced a steady increase in population over the years and as we move forward with an expansion, we



hope to contribute to an improved quality of life for all residents. It can also allow for the preservation of farmland, green spaces, parks and recreational areas, which in turn, creates a healthier and more livable environment.

2023-25 Biennium Budget Approved; Takes Effect July 1




City Council approved a 2023-2025 biennium budget at the June 5, 2023 City Council meeting.

This budget will take effect on July 1, 2023. During the budget creation process, the North Plains City Council, the City's Budget Committee, and city staff worked to create a budget that aligns with the city's goals, priorities, and strategic initiatives.

"North Plains - the fastest growing city in the Portland-area - is on the precipice of lasting change and this budget reflects the planning, the service levels, and the personnel to make this transition toward the future," says North Plains City Manager Andy Varner. "Our intent is to put North Plains on a solid and sustainable financial footing for many years to come so that we can provide exceptional services to our residents and businesses."

Art Lab Monday, July 31st at 1 pm at Jessie Mays



Chief's Corner: Vehicle Theft



July is Vehicle Theft Prevention Month. We encourage community members to keep their vehicles safe by following these simple steps to avoid costly crimes:

Chief James Haxton

- Never leave your keys inside your vehicle.
- Close and lock all windows and doors at all times.
- Never leave valuables in your vehicle, especially if they are visible from the outside.
- Remove your garage door opener from your car when you are home.
- Pay attention to your surroundings and park in well-lit and open areas, if possible.

If you fall victim to vehicle crimes, file a police report by calling non-emergency dispatch at 503-629-0111, or file a report online at https://bit.ly/WCSO_Reporting, if it meets the criteria. To file a report, you must know your license plate number, make, model, color of your vehicle, and VIN.
