City Begins Process to Set 2023-25 Biennial Budget

City staff are working on a suggested budget, and in April we will officially kick off the budget review and approval process for the next biennial (2-year) budget which begins on July 1, 2023.

During this process, the North Plains City Council, the City's Budget Committee, and city staff work to create a budget that aligns with the City's goals, priorities, and strategic initiatives. The 2023-25 budget process will be

slightly different this year because of

the Public Safety Local Option Levy referred to North Plains voters by City Council on the upcoming May 16, 2023, general election. The Budget Committee will consider two different biennial budgets, with and without the local option levy, and then make a

final recommendation to City Council at a May 24, 2023 meeting dependent on the May 16 election results.

The 2023 schedule includes:

- March 6: City Council work session with the Budget Committee to preview themes and issues affecting the 2023-25 budgeting process
- **April 13:** City Manager releases a proposed 2023-25 biennial budget
- April 19 & May 3 (if necessary): Budget Committee meetings to discuss proposed budget
- May 24: Budget Committee reconvenes and votes to recommend a biennial budget to City Council that reflects the results of the Police Services Local Option Levy from the May 16 general election
- June 5: City Council budget public hearing and consideration of approval to adopt the budget

Budget Background & Challenges

As a small City, North Plains has operated on a conservative budget for many years. Due to our current and projected population growth, the increasing cost of doing business, and investments needed in maintenance

and upkeep, we are facing service-level challenges. North Plains' rapid growth as a bedroom community to serve employers outside of North Plains has also resulted in an imbalance in the tax base, with our city having a heavy reliance on residential taxes and very little on business taxes like other Washington County cities.

The City of North Plains is committed to financial sustainability and is working on important short, medium, and long-term strategies to ensure the city will be able to meet the expanding needs and expectations for services so our community has the services it needs and the best quality of life possible. A North Plains City Council goal is to shore up fiscal sustainability, safety, and service levels that provide a comparable quality of life to other Western Washington County communities.

Chief's Corner: Should you leave your child home alone?

How do I know if it's safe to leave my child home alone?

With spring break on the horizon for many students this time of year, many parents wonder, "Is my child old enough to stay home alone?"

This question is challenging because it really depends

on the maturity of the child. Ask yourself these questions to help inform your decision:

- Does my child know how to get help in case of an emergency, like calling 9-1-1 or going to a neighbor's house.
- Does my child have access to a phone and a list of important numbers to call in case of an emergency?



Have rules been established? Some rules might include not having friends over, not answering the phone, not opening the door to visitors and keeping all doors locked, no cooking (or establishing what

appliances can be used) and checking in with a parent or caretaker at pre-determined times.

Remember: Not all children mature at the same rate. As your child grows older and stays home alone, you must ensure they follow established rules and possess the life skills to do so.

Downtown Improvement Planning Progressing

Have you wondered what a stronger and enhanced downtown in North Plains might look like?

Since 2021, we've been seeking community input and working on creating a North Plains Downtown Improvement Plan to do just that.

At its meeting #3 on January 31, 2023, the Downtown Plan project advisory committee (PAC) considered and discussed the plan recommendations for business, infrastructure, and code improvements. The next steps will include a project team work session with the Planning Commission in March, immediately followed by a work session with the City Council.

The goal is to have the plan ready for City Council final adoption in April. Once adopted, we will begin planning a timeline for implementation.

At the February 6, 2023, City Council meeting, the North Plains City Council unanimously approved a resolution to submit a measure to provide overnight police patrol and related services to North Plains voters on the May 16, 2023, general election ballot.

Young Women Can Explore a Career as a Firefighter



Applications are being accepted for Portland Metro Fire Camp for young women ages 16 to 22. This camp is an all-encompassing Tualatin Valley introduction to a rewarding profession. The camp is designed to instill

confidence while building leadership and team skills.

Participants will learn what it takes to be a firefighter while completing hands-on training in hose and ladder skills, vehicle extrication, search and rescue, ropes and knots, live-fire operations, aerial ladder climbs, forcible entry, emergency medical skills, and other firefighting tasks.

They will also receive instruction from professional female firefighters from multiple agencies on how to prepare for interviews and gain

insight on what it's like to have a career in the fire service as well as the importance of good nutrition and physical fitness.

This free fire camp will be offered twice this summer on two weekends. The first camp will be held July 14,

> 15, and 16 at the Portland Fire & Rescue Training Center, 4800 NE 122nd Ave., in Portland.

The second camp will take place July 21, 22, and 23 at Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue's Training Center, 12400 SW Tonquin Road, in Sherwood.

The deadline to apply for both camps is May 1 at midnight. Space is limited.


