While self-help is the cornerstone of the program, a trained staff is available to assist residents in the transition from dependence on alcohol and other substances to a substance free lifestyle. All members of the program must attend an outpatient program which is coordinated

with the service plan offered at Arbor House. The length of stay is usually 6-9 months.

<u>Project U-Turn</u> This program is designed for under-age youths who have been charged with DWI, DWAI or any other zero-tolerance related offense. It is provided in cooperation with the Oswego County STOP-DWI. This program is a client-fee supported series of two, 3-hour sessions. Project U-Turn is an OASAS approved Alcohol Awareness Program for youth.

<u>Project Intervention</u>: This program is designed for non-violent first-time drug offenders aged 25 and younger that are charged with the use or possession of drugs or drug paraphernalia. It is provided in cooperation with the District Attorney's Office. This program is a client-fee supported series of two, 2-hour sessions.

Responsible Server Training (RST) This program is designed for anyone who distributes or serves alcoholic beverages and educates how to sell or serve responsibly. There are two different formats of this program, one for onsite drinking venues and one for venues that sell alcohol to be consumed off-site. Responsible Server Training is a GCASA program certified by the New York State Liquor Authority.

You(th) Decide-Youth Gambling Prevention Decision You(th) Decide is a gambling prevention initiative designed to increase community awareness about risks associated with problem gambling and how adolescents are more susceptible to developing gambling problems. This is a state initiative lead by the New York State Council on Problem Gambling.

The Farnham Family Services Training Institute was established in 2017 and delivers a growing combination of courses designed to professionally enhance the skills of experienced and new professionals in the Substance Use Counseling field, Peers entering the Certified Recovery Advocacy profession, Prevention professionals and additional human service providers. The individual courses are tailored to a specific topic, however, they are open to individuals at all levels of experience. The trainings are available to both employees of Farnham Family Services and community members alike.

The Training Institute is a certified training program through both the New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse (OASAS) and through the New York State Certification Board (NYCB). We are also a Best Practice Trainer agency designated by FOR-NY. The Training Institute is certified to provide training for initial certification (350 hour course) recertification courses for Credentialed Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Counselor (CASAC), Certified Prevention Professional (CPP), and Certified Prevention Specialist (CPS) and the initial and recertification for the Certified Recovery Peer Advocate (CRPA) as well as Certified Recovery Peer Advocate-Family (CRPA-F).

All the trainings published on the Farnham Website are open to the community and are held in the Farnham Family Services Training Institute which is located in the Farnham Oswego Office at 283 West Second Street, Oswego, NY 13126, unless otherwise noted.

Up to date substance abuse prevention information and programming is available to parents, schools, health professionals, and other organizations concerned about substance abuse related issues. Presentations range from information concerning alcohol and other drug use and its effects on the body to prevention skills-building for all ages. Prevention skills-building includes learning about Resiliency and Asset-Building with youth and community, self-esteem development, decision-making, problem-solving, building positive activities habits, exploration and appropriate expression of feelings, as well as self-assessing for high-risk indicators for use (family history, lack of adequate support, genetic predisposition, few skills for stress reduction/coping skills, etc.).

Program activities include: Prevention services use a pro-active, research-based, data-driven process utilizing proven-effective strategies and programs to reduce or prevent alcohol and other drug abuse in individuals, families, and communities. The program assesses risk and protective factors. A focused prevention approach in planning and using data-based predictors of problem behaviors and positive outcomes. The program services aim to prevent problem behavior and promote healthy development among children, adolescents, and young adults. The program services selected for the site were identified as the most appropriate evidence-based programs and strategies for the target populations to effectively achieve the outcome of reducing or avoiding substance use/abuse, by focusing resources on reducing those risk factors specific to the community the services are provided in.

Prevention counseling services provides short-term, problem-resolution-focused prevention service approach that is designed to assess and improve the levels of youth and family risk and protective factors to prevent or reduce substance use, problem gambling, and the negative consequences of such behaviors. Student Assistance Counselors implement evidence-based curriculum to prevent substance abuse, violence, delinquency and the risk and protective factors that predict these behaviors.

Loans available for start-ups and expansions of Fulton businesses. Two programs are currently available. Revolving Loan Fund provides assistance in amounts of \$10,000 to \$100,000 with approval by loan committee. Fund provides a maximum of 30% of total project costs for acquisition, construction, rehab, purchase of machinery/equipment, working capital and inventory. Program requires one full-time or two part-time low/mod income jobs be created for every \$10,000 of agency funds provided.

Micro enterprise Loan Fund Program provides technical assistance and low-interest loan funding for start-up or expansion for micro businesses. A "micro" is a commercial enterprise with five or fewer employees, of which at least one must be the owner. Loans are available from \$2,500 to \$25,000 with up to 6 month deferral of principal and interest. Technical assistance provided free of charge to all applicants. Successful completion of technical assistance required prior to disbursement of funds. All funding requires collateralization.

SAF accepts calls on a 24 hour, 7 day basis. Hotline personnel are certified rape crisis counselors and are able to assist any victim of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, and/or innocent victims of crime. The Hotline provides crisis intervention services to victims of violence in need of immediate assistance. In addition, it serves as the portal for clients and their support systems to access residential and non-residential victim services through the SAF program.

Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Program:

The program provides advocacy to victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, child abuse, stalking, and innocent victims of violent crimes. Services include but are not limited to: Hotline assistance, crisis intervention, advocacy, follow-up, information and referral, assistance with locating and securing safe, affordable housing, transitional housing support, transportation assistance to appointments (when applicable) temporary shelter, and case management services. Victims can request assistance with completing petitions for Orders of Protection and/or Custody, crisis advocacy to survivors of sexual assault by meeting them at hospital emergency rooms and/or law enforcement department offices, emotional support and assistance with navigating through the criminal and/or civil justice systems, assistance with restitution, assistance with preparing a victim impact statement, follow-up advocacy, and with advance notice staff can accompany survivors to court proceedings. Services are available to both victims of violence and their personal support systems. Individual and group counseling is available to assist participants to cope with the effects of abuse. Staff are entitled to the Rape Crisis Counselor Legal Privilege, which allows staff to maintain confidentiality of information revealed to them even if called to testify as a witness in a trial or other proceeding.

Temporary shelter stays and Transitional housing services may be requested through the Crisis Hotline (315-342-1600) 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The Transitional Housing program will offer individualized services such as counseling, temporary financial assistance, support groups, safety planning, and advocacy services as well as practical services such as licensed child care, employment services, transportation vouchers, telephones, and referrals to other agencies. Program staff works with victims to help them determine and reach their goals of permanent housing.

<u>Crime Victim's Program:</u> SAF Staff are also funded through the New York State Office of Victim Services to assist any innocent victims of crime. Staff can assist crime victims in applying for compensation for out-of-pocket costs associated with a crime, including, but not limited to: medical costs, loss of personal property, transportation costs, crime scene clean-up, and lost wages. Staff can also provide case management and advocacy to crime victim to address their immediate and on-going needs.

<u>Trainings and Community Education:</u> Presentations are provided, upon request, to community groups and professionals looking to increase awareness, learn more about SAF Services, and learn more about the impact of victimization. SAF Staff can provide training and education on topics related to domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, elder abuse, and human trafficking. Common training topics include: the effects of batterers on children, understanding domestic violence victimization and barriers to leaving, the myth of mutual battering and determining primary aggressor, teen dating violence victimization, the dynamics of abuse in later life, trauma-informed response to victims and survivors, responding to victims of sexual assault, and crime victim's compensation. Staff are available to present to local law enforcement, social service providers, caseworkers, health care staff, teachers and educators, and any other community groups. Community education and professional trainings can be tailored to meet the needs of the intended audience.

School-based Prevention Education: Age-appropriate education on victimization is available to middle school, high school, and college students in Oswego County. SAF Staff utilize a violence prevention curriculum, which includes videos and small and large group activities, to educate students on topics related to domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, and human trafficking. Activities and discussion specifically focus on: warning signs of an unhealthy relationship, types of abuse, barriers to leaving an abusive relationship, qualities of a healthy relationship, bystander response, victim-blaming, consent, drug-facilitated sexual assault, current statistics on victimization, and how to reach out for help. The curriculum can be adapted to accommodate students with a disability.

<u>Victimization Prevention Curriculum:</u> For middle, senior, and college-aged students as used by our Educator/Trainer. At the beginning of each school year, each school district and college personnel are contacted by the Educator/Trainer. Materials reviewed will, at minimum, consist of: age-appropriate prevention curriculum outlines, a description of the Services to Aid Families Programs, and proposed follow-up activities. This curriculum has also been adapted to accommodate classrooms with students who have developmental disabilities.

The Oswego County Office for the Aging (OFA) helps seniors through directly provided services such as case management, insurance counseling, the Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP), and outreach. Services contracted to other agencies and funded through OFA include: senior nutrition service, transportation, legal services, health promotion, personal care aides and housekeeper chore aides.

There are no fees for most OFA services. Voluntary contributions are suggested and gladly accepted. Programs are funded by federal, state and county grants through the Administration for Community Living, the NYS Office for the Aging and the Oswego County Office for the Aging, sponsored by Oswego County Government.

Services:

•Outreach Program - Staff outreach into the community to locate those who are unaware of available services. Staff can make visits to those who are homebound due to poor health or lack of transportation.

•Senior Nutrition Program – Eligible participants are provided meals for the more rural, isolated elderly in the county through the Home Delivered Meals Program or may attend a congregate meal site (Senior Dining and Activity Center) located at 6 sites throughout the County.

•Transportation – Participants of our Senior Dining and Activity Centers are eligible for transportation to sites and shopping. OFA also sponsors Call N Ride providing transportation to Doctor Appointments, Social Engagements or Shopping free of charge to Oswego County residents age 60+.

•Legal Referral – Residents 60+ years old can be referred to a local attorney through our legal referral program. Seniors can obtain information, guidance and legal representation, dependent on whether or not a legal problem exists.

•Health Insurance Information Counseling and Assistance Program (HIICAP) Provides unbiased health insurance and prescription insurance counseling for those who are Medicare eligible.

•Home Care Program – Provides (under Subcontract) in-home care (personal care and/or housekeeper chore) services for those 60+ years old who require assistance to remain in their own homes. Participants in program may be required to pay a percentage of the cost of service, or make contributions.

•Caregiver Services Program - Provide caregivers with much needed support through counseling, support groups and respite services. Caregiver services are vital to keeping older people safely in their homes.

The Upstate New York Poison Center of Upstate Medical University is a telephone service available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year for poison emergencies or for poison information. The Center manages over 80,000 calls annually, with about 50% of the calls involving children under the age of six. Over 85% of these cases are successfully treated at home through telephone consultation, eliminating unnecessary trips to the Emergency Department. About 30% of total calls to the poison center are from healthcare facilities seeking the expertise of poison center specialists.

The poison center is responsible for a 54-county catchment area of NYS. It is staffed by registered nurses certified by the American Association of Poison Control Centers as Specialists in Poison Information with consultation provided by both medical and clinical toxicologists. Additionally, the Center maintains a list of other consultants, specialists in their field, to help in the management as necessary.

Education for health care professionals is accomplished through: case conferences held weekly at the center, clinical rotations for physicians, pharmacists, nurses and other health care professionals; in-services conducted for hospital staff throughout the 54 county service area; Toxicology Teaching Day held in Syracuse, NY each Fall; and through the center's drug information services. Public educational programs for children, parents, seniors and many other segments of the population are customized for the needs of the target audience. Health educators promote poison prevention awareness in local communities and work closely with identified points-of-service agencies to provide educational programming and materials to the communities served by the Center.

The service coordinator will also help the entire family receive services according to their needs. The service coordinator can help the family access other services such as parent support groups, funding assistance, such as PHCP, Medicaid, SSI, WIC and advocacy services. This program is a very family centered program.

<u>Child Find</u> The focus of the Child Find Component of the Early Intervention Program is to ensure children are engaged in primary health care where they will receive periodic developmental surveillance and screening. The Child Find staff work in partnership with area physician's to ensure that children who are at risk for developmental delays or disabilities, receive appropriate developmental monitoring. The Child Find program can help parent's keep track of their child's development through periodic contact with program staff, through parent questionnaires and by maintaining contact with their primary physicians.

<u>Preventive Services</u>: * Preventive Services for children and families is designed to support families by providing services and resources needed to strengthen the family unit which enable families to remain intact and avoid unnecessary placement of children in foster care.

<u>Foster Care Services</u>: * Foster Care Services provides temporary care to children who are unable to remain with their family due to serious problems within the family. Caseworkers work to reunite the family. If a child cannot return to his or her family, the agency works to develop a permanent plan for the child through adoption, or if the child is older, by assisting them to learn the skills needed to live independently.

<u>Child Protective Services</u>: * Child Protective Services includes the receipt of reports of suspected abuse and maltreatment of children in Oswego County from the NYS State Central Register. A caseworker is assigned to each situation to assess the risk factors and safety of the children involved and to determine if the family needs assistance in order to keep their children safe.

<u>Family Assessment Response (FAR) Protective Services:</u> FAR begins in the same manner as an investigative response: a report of child abuse or maltreatment is received by the State Central Register. Once the report of abuse or maltreatment is transmitted to the local district, it is screened for the most appropriate response based on the county's FAR criteria. Child Safety is achieved through family engagement and collaborative partnerships. Parents are seen and engaged as partners in maintaining child safety. Families lead the process of identifying solutions, appropriate resources and services, both formal and informal, that they feel will best meet their needs. Within FAR, the focus is on gaining and understanding of the family's functioning through a comprehensive assessment of safety, risk, strengths and needs.

Adult Protective: * Protective Services for Adults (PSA): Services provided to assist adults age 18 or older who, because of mental or physical impairments can no longer provide for their basic needs for food, clothing, shelter or medical care, or protect themselves from neglect, abuse or hazardous situations, and who have no one willing and able to help in a responsible manner.

Food \$en\$e Program:

Food \$en\$e offers the opportunity to stretch your food budget by purchasing quality food at a discount. No donated food is used in this program.

- Who is eligible?
 - Anyone who needs to stretch their food dollars can participate. It's a buying club you are not required to show proof of income.
- How does it work?

SERVICES:

Assistance Programs:

SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program): SNAP is a federal program to help families & individuals to meet their basic food needs. This is a program based on financial eligibility. Eligibility factors include household size, income, verification of identity and citizenship for persons earning up to 130% of the federal poverty level. This requires an application to be filed and an interview to be conducted. Applications may be filed online at www.mybenefits.ny.gov or requested from the Oswego County Department of Social Services.

HEAP (Home Energy Assistance Program): HEAP is a federally funded energy assistance program for low-income households. It is seasonal program based on eligibility determined by income and type of home heating. There are *regular and emergency benefits*. These are one-time payments that are meant to offset the high cost of home heating during the heating season. The program is only available until the funding is exhausted.

New York State of Health (*Medicaid, Family Health Plus, Child Health Plus*): The Healthy New York initiative is health insurance for poor or low-income families or individuals who cannot afford to pay for medical care. There is a financial eligibility process that includes proof of identity, income, household members, and resources. Applications may be obtained through the NY State of Health website (www.nystateofhealth.ny.gov), by calling 1-855-355-5777.

Temporary Assistance (Family Assistance or Safety Net Assistance): Temporary Assistance is a program to help eligible families or individuals to meet basic needs such as shelter and utility payments. Program may provide a one-time payment to meet an emergency need or on-going cash assistance to meet basic needs. Eligibility requirements include assessment of all income and resources, housing expenses and household members. Adults are required to engage in an assessment for work readiness and will be required to participate in work activities in most cases. Applications are available through the Department of Social Services. A face-to-face appointment for eligibility determination is required. Relatives with custody or care for a child whose parent is unable to take care of them may be able to receive assistance on behalf of the child.

Child Support:

The Child Support Program helps to legally establish paternity and collect and distribute financial and medical support for children up to age 21 when one or both parents are absent from the household. Staff can assist in location of absent parents, prepare a petition for support and collect and distribute payments to the caretaker of the child. Under law, both parents are responsible for the financial support of a child even if they have never lived with the child.

This is a mandated reporters hotline, available 24 hours a day, seven days a week for the purpose of reporting cases of suspected child abuse anywhere in New York State. Information is received by the Child Abuse Hotline in Albany. If it is during regular Social Service hours, Albany contacts the Mexico office and they act on it.

If it is after hours, Albany contacts the assigned on-call caseworker. The on-call caseworker then calls Albany back for information and then acts on it. In any case, the original caller is contacted by the local CPS worker if they give their name and number to Albany. Name of caller will be requested but it is not required. The subject of an abuse report can request a copy of the report, but the source of information is always kept confidential.

A child protective worker will visit the home of the subject of the complaint and has the power to remove the child or children from the home if the child is found to be in imminent danger. A court order has to be obtained by them soon thereafter. The Child Protective Unit always acts to protect the child. The Child Protective caseworker must make a prompt and accurate determination to prevent injury to the child's welfare.

ARISE has two peer leaders, one of which is a master trainer.

<u>DSMP</u> (Diabetes Self Management Program) The class runs the same timeline as the basic material is the same as the CDSMP program. This class will dial down into more of the nuts and bolts of being diabetic or living with someone that is diabetic. Pre-registration is required. ARISE has two peer leaders for this program.

NDPP (National Diabetic Prevention Program) This class runs for one hour and the schedule will last over a period of one year. Classes start out weekly and then go to monthly. This class is for those that have been diagnosed as beign pre-diabetic or have concerns that they will be diabetic based on family history. Class is self directed by the group as they will choose the subject matter for the term of the classes.

Any individual with a disability enrolled on the Medicaid Home and Community-Based Waiver, from the age of 3 years and up can exercise the option of using Self-Directed Services.

Developmental Disabilities Program

Mental Health Program

Supervised Residence - This residence provides 24 hour supervision to individuals over age 18 who have a mental illness. The consumers must have a desire to participate in treatment that is authorized by the treating psychiatrist. Individuals are assisted with developing skills necessary to attain their highest level of independence, with one goal of reintegration into the community and/or transition to the Treatment Apartment Program.

Treatment Apartments – The apartments provide a less supervised living situation for a more independent life, with staff visits four to seven times weekly depending upon the individual's needs. It also provides 24 hour on-call staffing for emergency and crisis situations for adults with a diagnosed mental illness.

Crisis Bed – This service consists of providing a temporary placement for a hospital diversion and hospital step down. The service provides crisis support to individuals who are not in need of psychiatric hospitalization, but are in need of some level of supervised short term 24 hour support. Must be referred by the evaluating psychiatrist.

BMEN participants are informed, during registration/ orientation, about what will be required of them in order to comply with the program's policies and practices. They are also made aware that non-compliance is immediately reported to the court.Based on a Power and Control Analysis, weekly batterer accountability sessions are attended by men who have been mandated by courts (including criminal, Domestic Violence, Family and/or Integrated Domestic Violence) the Probation Department, or other agencies to address their abusive behavior towards a partner. Participants must complete and pay for 26 sessions each for 1 hour a week. There is a fee for the intake and weekly service and participants must complete an intake process prior to joining the Program.
