Notification of Reappointment of Commission Members

Director Klingelsmith went through each project individually and explained the grant process and funding source. As part of the grant requirements, a resolution by the highest governing board is

needed. The recommendation of the Parks and Recreation Commission to City Council is an important step in the process.

Commissioner Turk opened the public hearing. No public wished to comment on the projects. Commissioner Turk closed the public hearing.

Motion to recommend that City Council authorize the submittal of a Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund application to the Michigan Department Of Natural Resources requesting funding for the Winter Sports Park Hockey Rink Pavilion for 50% of the \$600,000 project was made by Commissioner Schemanski, seconded by Commissioner Buchanan, with all members present voting aye.
