Message from the Village Administrator

Water and wastewater services are a core service offered by municipalities – the goal of providing these services are to make you forget about their operations. This is achieved by reducing interruptions, keeping rates affordable, and providing excellent service consistently. However, the Village of Plain City is not alone in struggling to keep up with strict and costly operating procedures, while still endeavoring to provide affordable services to residents.

The Big Darby Creek is one of our area's best amenities, and with that come firm state and federal regulations on our utility services. These guidelines, as well as aging facilities and a desire to provide high quality water to residents, have reached a point where

the Village has decided that regionalizing utility systems with Madison County is the best path forward to leverage resources. To this end, the Mid Ohio Water & Sewer District (MOWSD) has been created and is in operation. Soon, residents will begin to receive bills from this provider instead of the Village. The employees of MOWSD have been working with the Village water and wastewater plants for years and we have the upmost confidence that they will be able to manage the current plants, provide reliable services, and provide a successful path forward for utilities as the Village experiences growth.

Be on the lookout for additional communication regarding this update to water and sewer services. The Village will still be billing separately for trash pickup. For the time being, you will still also be able to drop off water and sewer payments at the Municipal Building. And, of course, you can call us with any questions that you may have or stop by for anything else you might need.

The Village looks forward to a successful partnership with MOWSD and ensuring reliable utilities for years to come.

New Economic Development Strategy Nears Completion

Following several months of work, Plain City's first economic development strategy is nearing completion with Council approval expected in October. In January, the Village partnered with the Montrose Group to develop a clear framework for the Village's economic development initiatives. The resulting strategy provides a number of objectives designed to help the village realize its full economic potential. The strategy focuses on business retention, expansion, and attraction; preparing sites for future economic development, revitalization of the Uptown District, and improving organizational capacity.

The Village wishes to thank the members of the steering committee and residents and business owners who assisted with the project.

Permit, Zoning, or Project Questions? We're Here to Help.

The Planning & Zoning Department offers these friendly reminders:

- Residential Common required Zoning Permits include, but not limited to; fences, sheds, decks, pergolas, pools, and additions. This includes the installation of a new structure or the replacement of an existing structure.
- Commercial Required Zoning Permits include, but limited to; any new occupancy or relocation, exterior building change, exterior painting or repainting, modification, addition or any signage (temporary or permanent). Many commercial permits require review/approval from Planning Commission or Design Review Board as well.

New Dog Park at Jackson Street

The Parks & Recreation is excited to announce the arrival of the first ever Dog Park in the Village! Currently in the design phase, the Dog Park at Jackson Street will be a 2-acre paradise for pups and owners alike! The dog park will have both a small and large dog area, and will include a walking path, benches, large open play areas, a large shelter house, and a pooch splash area for the pups who love water. This project was created in direct response to the community's input from the 2020 Parks & Recreation Master Plan, where residents voiced their priorities and wishes. Construction is anticipated to begin next spring with opening anticipated early summer.

Madison Meadows Community Park

Nestled in the heart of the new Madison Meadows neighborhood is a brand-new Village Park. The park will have a dedicated parking lot, a rentable shelter house with attached bathrooms, youth sports fields, and a new playground. The playground received partial funding through an ODNR NatureWorks grant, and we are thrilled to be able to offer some new play facilities to the community. The project will be completed by late spring 2024.

Park & Aquatic Center Improvements

As summer winds down, you may notice that improvements are being made in Plain City's parks, thanks to the hard work of our Public Works Department. Various park improvements include:

- New paved driveway access to McKitrick Park for safer entry and exit
- Paved walkway around the Youth Building at Pastime Park
- New gravel parking area adjacent to the Youth Building
- New concrete flooring in the Cattle Barn makes it much more usable
- Two new dog waste stations at Pastime Park

While not as visible as many of the other park projects, investing in ongoing maintenance and upgrades at the Aquatic Center is equally important. Some of the projects being done at the pool include:

- Repair of play structures in the kiddie area
- Improvements to electrical in the concession stand
- New stanchions for swim team flags
- Complete replacement of the filter media and tank fittings that will help to improve the filtration of pool water
- Improvement to the Splash Pad infrastructure

Halloween Safety Tips

Leaf & Brush Collection Reminder

September 29 will be the final day for brush pick up. After this date, residents may take their brush to Kurtz Brothers or arrange collection with Local Waste. Leaf Collection typically begins in mid-October, however, it will depend on when leaves begin to fall.

Utilities

Winter Water Pipe Preparation

As winter approaches, it's important to prepare your pipes to prevent costly and inconvenient water breaks. Below are some helpful reminders:

Insulate Exposed Pipes

- Identify and insulate any exposed pipes in your home, especially those in unheated areas like basements, crawlspaces, and garages.
- Use pipe insulation sleeves or heat tape to keep the pipes warm and prevent freezing.

Drain Outdoor Faucets and Hoses

- Disconnect and drain garden hoses, and store them indoors during winter.
- Shut off the outdoor water supply and open outdoor faucets to allow any remaining water to drain.

Seal Leaks and Cracks

 Inspect your home for gaps, cracks, or holes near pipes that could let cold air in. Seal them with caulk or insulation to keep the area around pipes warmer.

Know the Location of Your Main Water Shut-Off Valve

 Familiarize yourself with the location of the main water shut-off valve in case of an emergency. Knowing how to turn it off can save you from major water damage.

Consider Professional Inspection

 If you live in an older home or an area with extreme cold, consider hiring a professional to inspect your plumbing system for vulnerabilities.

Taking these steps can save you time, money, and the inconvenience of dealing with water breaks during the colder months.

Is Your Utility Information Updated?

If you have recently moved into a new home or are planning to move out of our community, please make sure to contact the Village to register your utility information. This is an important step that helps prevent any future billing issues, disputes, delinquencies, and shut-offs. Registering or updating your utility information will ensure that you receive accurate bills and avoid problems with your utilities.
