Comments

Mayor Dan Keller and Council took a few moments to commemorate the 22nd anniversary to the September 11, 2001 terrorist attack.

Mayor Dan Keller quoted LDS President Gordon B. Hinkley. "Occasions of this kind pull us up sharply to a realization that life is fragile, peace is fragile, civilization itself is fragile. The economy is particularly vulnerable. Let us be prayerful. Let us pray for righteousness, let us pray for the forces of good. Let us reach out and to help men and women of goodwill, whatever their religious persuasion and wherever they live. We can be an influence for good in this world, every one of us." Everyone beyond the age of 26 likely remembers where they were, and the feelings they felt when they heard the news. Lives were forever affected.

Councilmember Terry Larson stated that he remembers exactly where he was when he heard the news. After the events, we stood united as a country. Today, we are again divided as a country. Americans need to work towards getting back to the unity, each of us need to strive to find unity in today's world.

Councilmember Chris Larsen remembers as a teenager, watching the second plane attack the twin towers, and realizing this wasn't acting, this was an actual attack on our country. Family members and friends were directly affected by the events, and he is still very grateful to those who have served, who are currently serving, and those who will serve in our armed forces. Councilmember Chris Larsen reminisced on the picture of President Bush reading to elementary students when his press secretary came in and whispered to him what had happened. The look on the president's face when he realized what was going on made a lasting impression.

Councilmember Todd Thomas reflected on the time that he lived in New York for a few months. During that time, he visited the world trade center and toured the observation deck. On September 11, 2001, he thought, "I once stood there." America stood together, indivisible.

City Engineer Tyrell Simpson presented a map of the sewer line around Larson Drive. It is difficult to tell if the sewer could flow back to the North, as Mr. Keith Cole has asked. The elevations of the existing manholes suggest that it cannot be done without adding a lift station, and the costs would be over \$170,000 for the line, work and lift station. It does not seem economical to redirect the sewer main, as the existing sewer main functions properly.

It was suggested that the Coles work together with Engineer Tyrell Simpson to find a way they can build the garage and carport without disrupting the sewer system.
