PROPOSED LOCAL LAW 2 OF 2021

A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING THE OFFICE OF THE OSWEGO COUNTY PUBLIC DEFENDER

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF OSWEGO AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: PURPOSE AND INTENT.

The County of Oswego, through the County Legislature, recognizes its responsibility in providing quality publicly supported legal representation to indigent persons under the County Law. To that end, the Legislature seeks to create the Oswego County Public Defender's Office, and it is the intent of this Local Law to establish a framework to achieve that goal in accordance with the laws of the State of New York.

Section 2: PUBLIC DEFENDER: QUALIFICATIONS; APPOINTMENT; TERM.

Effective January 1, 2022, there shall be an Office of the Oswego County Public Defender created and established. The Public Defender shall be appointed by the County legislature for a (2) two-year term; the initial term of office may be less depending on time of appointment so that the term of office coincides with the term of the County Legislature. The Public Defender shall be directly responsible to the County Legislature and shall have graduated from an ABA accredited law school with a law degree. S/he shall be admitted to the practice of law in the State of New York in good standing and shall be continuously admitted thereto during the term of office. S/he shall have at least (10) ten years' experience as a practicing attorney in the field of criminal law and or in Family Court, at least three years of which shall have involved trial practice. The Public Defender shall hold no other public or political office, shall devote working full-time to the County and shall be a resident of the County of Oswego during the term of office.

Section 3: GENERAL POWERS.

- **A.** The Public Defender shall, as herein provided, act as representative of the County of Oswego in the provision of legal services to the indigent of the County.
- B. 1. The Public Defender shall represent, without charge at the request of an indigent defendant, or by order of the court with the consent of the defendant, each indigent defendant who is charged with a crime as defined in Section 722-a of the County Law in the county in which such Public Defender serves. The term "crime" shall mean a felony, misdemeanor, or the breach of any law of this state or of any law, local law or ordinance of a political subdivision of this state, other than one that defines a "traffic infraction," for which a sentence to a term of imprisonment is authorized upon conviction thereof. When representing an indigent defendant, the Public Defender shall counsel and represent defendant at every stage of the proceedings following arrest, shall initiate such proceedings as in his/her judgment are necessary to protect the rights of the accused, and may, in his/her discretion, prosecute any appeal, if in his/her judgment the facts and circumstances warrant such appeal.
 - 2. The Public Defender shall also represent, without charge, in a proceeding in Family Court or Surrogate's Court in the county or counties where such public defender serves, any person entitled to counsel pursuant to Section 262 and Section 1120 of the Family Court Act, and Section 407 of the Surrogate's Court Procedure Act, or any person entitled to counsel pursuant to Article 6-C of the Correction Law, or other related matters under County Law Article 18-A who is financially unable to obtain counsel. When representing such person, the public defender shall counsel and represent him at every stage of the proceedings, shall initiate such proceedings as in the judgment of the public defender are necessary to protect the rights of such person, and may prosecute any appeal when, in his judgment the facts and circumstances warrant such appeal.
- C. In addition, the Public Defender may assign professional, technical, and clerical personnel in the investigation, preparation, conduct and appeal in any court proceedings involving indigent defendants. The Public Defender shall be responsible for the management and operation of the Public Defender's Office in accordance with sound management principles, County Legislature's policies, and Civil Service law, and shall have the powers and duties necessary to carry out the functions of the office as set

forth herein and such other responsibilities as may from time to time be imposed by resolution of the County Legislature. The Public Defender's duties shall include but not be limited to:

- 1. Developing, managing, and submitting budgets for approval by the County Administrator and County Legislature;
- 2. Appointing, hiring, laying-off, suspending, disciplining and/or removing any person employed in the Public Defender's Office in accordance with Civil Service Law and/or collective bargaining units:
- 3. Establishing and overseeing office policies;
- 4. Preparing statistical and other reports as required by the State of New York Office of Indigent Legal Services, the County Legislature for presentation to the community, the Courts, and any other appropriate entity;
- Representing indigent defendants charged with crimes and in other proceedings in local criminal courts, County Court, Surrogate's Court, Family Court and Supreme Court, state Appellate Courts and Sex Offender Registration Act (SORA) matters;
- Overseeing investigations concerning cases handled by the office:
- 7. Assigning professional, technical and/or clerical personnel to assist in the cases:
- 8. Apply for, manage and administer state and federal grant funds pertaining to the office; and
- 9. Such other and further powers and duties as required by law or as required by the County Legislature.

SECTION 4: POWERS OF APPOINTMENT AND REMOVAL.

Subject to the limitations of the Civil Service Law, the Public Defender is vested with the power and authority to appoint, supervise, discipline, and remove assistant public defenders and employees, and assign and re-assign powers and duties to such employees, consistent with the laws of the State of New York. Pursuant to Section 716 of Article 18-A of the County Law, the Public Defender may appoint a Deputy Public Defender and as many assistant attorneys, clerks, investigators, stenographers, and other employees as s/he may deem necessary, subject to the authorization of the County Legislature. The Deputy Public Defender and assistant attorneys shall be in the exempt class of the civil

service. The Public Defender shall appoint such deputy and assistant attorneys, whom shall serve at his or her pleasure.

SECTION 5: REMOVAL OF THE PUBLIC DEFENDER.

- A. Grounds for Removal. As maintaining the quality of indigent legal defense is critical to the County of Oswego, the Courts and those individuals represented by the Office of the Public Defender, the Public Defender shall be subject to removal by the County Legislature for any of the following reasons:
 - 1. Ineligibility to hold or maintain holding such office (e.g. suspended law license).
 - 2. Malfeasance, misfeasance, or non-feasance in office.
 - 3. Conviction of a crime or of a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude, or violation of the oath of office.
 - 4. Failure to perform his or her duties as provided by this Local Law in an honorable, competent, and reasonably efficient manner; or
 - 5. In the event the Public Defender becomes morally, physically, or mentally unfit to act on behalf of the County.

B. Procedures for Removal.

If the Public Defender is to be removed pursuant to this section, prior thereto the Public Defender shall be given a written statement of the reasons alleged for the proposed removal and opportunity to be heard in an executive session of the County Legislature before the County Legislature prior to the date on which the proposed removal is to take effect. The Public Defender shall have the right to an administrative hearing before a neutral hearing officer to be selected by the County Legislature who shall not be a county officer or employee during which a stenographic transcript shall be kept. The report of said hearing officer shall be advisory only upon the County Legislature which shall vote upon the removal in public session. Pending such hearing, the County Legislature may suspend the Public Defender from office provided that the period of suspension shall not exceed thirty (30) days. determination shall be reviewable in an Article 78 proceeding. Removal shall not be required where the office becomes vacant by operation of law (e.g. conviction of a felony, non-county resident).

- C. Holdover Provisions. For purposes of this local law, the failure of the County Legislature to reappoint an incumbent Public Defender to a new term of office shall not be deemed a removal or suspension of said Public Defender. The Public Defender shall continue as a holdover in office with full authority to act and receive compensation until his or her successor is appointed and qualified.
- D. **Assigned Counsel Plan Continued**. Nothing herein shall be construed as abolishing the county's Assigned Counsel Plan which is continued and shall remain available for conflicts of interest once the Office of Public Defender is fully functioning.

SECTION 6: CLASSIFICATION; SALARY

Pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Section 10, the Public Defender shall be placed in the unclassified service. The Public Defender shall have a salary set by the County Legislature in the annual budget or by resolution at time of appointment. The Public Defender shall enjoy the benefits of the Management Compensation Plan.

SECTION 7: CONFIDENTIAL SECRETARY.

The County Legislature may create the position of confidential secretary to the Public Defender. Such position shall be in the exempt class of the Civil Service. The Public Defender shall appoint such confidential secretary, whom shall serve at his or her pleasure.

SECTION 8: SEVERABILITY.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, subdivision, or other part of this local law, as written or in its application, shall be inconsistent with any federal or state statute, law, regulation or rule then the federal or state statute, law, regulation, or rule shall prevail. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, subdivision, or other part of this local law or its application shall be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order, judgment or legislation shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of the local law which shall remain in full force and effect except as limited such order or judgment.

SECTION 9: SEQRA DETERMINATION.

The County Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this local law constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(26) and/or (35) of Title 6 of the New York Code of Rules and Regulations (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection. The Clerk of the Legislature is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance as, may be necessary, in accordance with this local law.

SECTION 10: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Local Law shall take effect upon its adoption and being duly filed with the New York Secretary of State and Oswego County Clerk as provided by the Municipal Home Rule Law.

- 6. **Notices**. Any notice, demand, or request, required or agreed to be given hereunder by either party, shall be sufficiently given or served if in writing and signed by the party giving it, and mailed to the party to be notified as follows:

At the time the current budget was prepared it was believed that the Probation State Aid Block Grant was going to be reduced by 20%. Therefore, it was necessary to reduce the projected revenue in the corresponding budget line, as well as reduce the expenditure line for JRISC services. These services, which are 100% State funded, are provided via a contract with Cayuga Centers at a yearly cost of \$124,000. As the 20% reduction (\$24,800) did not occur, and the department will be receiving the Probation State Aid Block Grant in full, it is being requested that the applicable revenue and expenditure lines be increased by this amount.

Purpose:

To authorize and establish Capital Project #0721 Camp Hollis Renovations with an authorization level of \$12,788

Summary:

Concrete for Patio

To replace the surfacing of the patio area outside the Main Building. The existing
concrete has cracked and sunk in spots over the last 20 years since it was last
surfaced. In some areas, weeds are growing up through cracks on the surface. These
issues have created tripping and safety hazards in that area. It was recommended by
Buildings and Grounds and the Health Department to replace the surfacing.

Electrical Work for New Appliances

• A new convection oven was purchased for the Camp Hollis kitchen to replace the roughly 30-year-old stove. Additionally, a holding cabinet (hot box) was purchased. The convection oven will help expedite the preparation time for the kitchen staff, being able to mass produce food in a quicker and more efficient manner. Having a hot box that can hold 30 trays of food will ensure that hot foods are held/served at the proper temperature. The current electrical wiring cannot handle the electric demands the stove and holding cabinet calls for. Therefore, new circuits, disconnects and breakers need to be installed to accommodate these appliances.

Compressor/Condenser

 Vital components to keep the camps walk-in-cooler running. When these units were shut off and winterized at the end of the season, it was recommended that they be replaced based on their age, wear, and tear, and sounds they were making. They were last replaced in 2008. Replacement will ensure that all components will be operational for the 2022 season so food can be stored and the proper temperatures and there is no disruption to food service.

These funds are available to us currently in our 2021 budget; however, the work can't be done for various reasons until 2022.

Recommended Action:

The department recommends the Human Services Committee; the Finance & Personnel Committee and the Oswego County Legislature authorize the establishment of Capital Project #0721.

Purpose:

To amend the 2021 Office for the Aging budget to accept and allocate an additional \$398,731 in funding from the American Rescue Plan Act.

Background:

The New York State Office for the Aging (NYSOFA) has allocated funds under the American Rescue Plan Act to the Oswego County Office for the Aging (OFA) to be used for services to the elderly from the time span beginning April 1, 2021 and ending September 30, 2024.

The funding has been granted to be used for any eligible service. OFA will use the funding in the following way over the course of the next three years: to help cover the cost opening a senior center in vacant space at 70 Bunner St; to continue to provide transportation to Social Adult Day program in Baldwinsville; to help cover the cost of the meals program due to increased demand; to continue to provide weekend meals for elderly who are in need; to continue to fund the animatronic pet program and other in home contact and support programs; to provide additional respite for caregivers; to add funds to the caregiver Project Lifesaver program; to create a caregiver recognition event; and to provide funding for Tai Chi Evidence Base Health program provided by

RSVP.

The Department respectfully requests acceptance of this funding allocation. The attached budget modification reflects this request. Services are funded at 90%.

New Account for DSS to Pay Witness Fees + Mileage

DSS has struggled for several years to stay within the regulations to provide a \$15 Witness Fee and Mileage Reimbursement with Subpoenas served in child welfare cases in Family Court. Given the escalating number of subpoenas now being accepted by fax / email – largely pushed by the pandemic, there is a need for DSS to provide the statutory \$15 witness fee plus mileage through a check provided directly to the witness.

Service by fax or email saves the County the cost of paying for personal service, but they are still entitled to a witness fee/mileage check. When witnesses requested / approved of subpoenas being sent electronically via email / fax, our vendor, Legal Associates initially agreed to send out checks. The vendor has already voiced concerns about the rapid increase in the need for them to mail the witness fee checks without personal service, the level of work involved on their end, and the current rate they get paid for doing so (\$2). It is likely that they will increase the fee for this service at contract renewal as they have already requested an increase, which we refused.

Paying the witness fees is not easy. Many return the check or just never cash it. There are many complications in this process. What is clear, we need a quick and efficient process to issue checks and reconcile the account for those we are now delivering electronic subpoenas. It is anticipated that about 100 checks will go out monthly. That number may rise given that schools are beginning to accept electronic service of subpoenas.

After consultation with County Attorney Rich Mitchell and County Treasurer Kevin Gardner, DSS seeks approval from the Board of Legislators to open a new checking account that will solely be used for witness fees / mileage. The Financial Management unit of DSS will receive the referral from DSS Legal Services and will issue a check that same day to be delivered snail mail to the witness. To assure separation of duties, the Account Clerk will issue the check and a Senior Accountant will reconcile the account monthly. Checks will be electronically signed and listed under A6070543800 / WITFE – Fees and Services and broke out so that our Senior Accountant can reconcile the account with the Treasurer. **This is budget neutral** as the costs shift within this same budget line from expenses paid to Legal Associates to expenses paid under WITFE. Given that we have no history on this – it could end up less or more and will be adjusted as needed in the 2022 Budget.

It is important to note the majority of witnesses will need to have a subpoena served through a process server. DSS also anticipates a shortfall in Postage under budget line A6070542400 of approximately \$1,200. Should this occur in 2022, DSS will seek a budget modification to meet the increased expense. Most of these expenses are paid off the open child protective / foster care case. All federal IV E eligible cases are reimbursed 62% state revenue NET of federal 50% reimbursement. All other cases are reimbursed at 62%.

DSS Budget Modifications

PURPOSE:

DSS seeks to move expenses to meet deficits in several budget lines in the

2021 budget.

SUMMARY:

There are several budget lines that are inadequate to meet the year end

needs of the Department.

A projected \$950,000 deficit in Foster Care Expenses is primarily due to the New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) increasing the rates for residential and therapeutic care placements retroactive to 04/01/2021. OCFS recently released an Administrative Directive advising of an additional increase retroactive to 07/01/2021 that impact local county foster care rate and Adoption/KinGAP cases. Once the November abstract is received from the state, a more complete analysis can be made on what is from retro expenses and impact of rate increase on an on-going basis. It is undetermined if the additional funding needed to close out 2021 is met with this allocation.

DSS seeks to move **\$950,000 from A6140 545500 Safety Net** - Other Supplies & Expense **to A6070 545500 FC** Adult Family Services - Foster Care - Other Supplies & Expenses.

A projected \$9,900 deficit for overtime (over 40 hours/week) is due to the increase in court and workforce shortage in legal services and caseworkers. Activities are time sensitive and critical to assure the health and safety of vulnerable children.

DSS seeks to move \$9,900 from A6010 514300 Social Services Admin - Additional Hours to A6070 512000 Adult Family Services - Overtime Payments.

FISCAL IMPACT: Both budget modifications are budget neutral.

RECOMMENDED

ACTION: The Department of Social Services recommends that the Human Services Committee, Finance & Personnel Committee, and the Legislature approve these budget modifications.



To whom it may concern:

The NYS Tug Hill Commission has partnered with Central New York Regional Planning and Development Board, Mohawk Valley Economic Development District, the Development Authority of the North Country, and AdkAction to provide two broadband data products to cover the 11-county region. The 11 counties include Lewis, Jefferson, Saint Lawrence, Oswego, Onondaga, Cayuga, Cortland, Oneida, Herkimer, Warren, and Washington counties. One product will be a public-facing map with generalized target areas identified based on ECC Technologies' final reports, each counties' broadband infrastructure layers, and county feedback. This public-facing map will protect proprietary and security concerns related to broadband infrastructure. The second product will be a PostGIS broadband database provided to our regional partners and counties upon receipt of a signed data sharing agreement.

A Public-Facing Map

A public-facing map with data hosted in a PostGIS database will include e-911 address points, U.S. Department of Agriculture's Rural Digital Opportunity Fund winning broadband bidders, broadband target areas according to final ECC reports, and census data by census block (e.g., population, median household income, and number of households). This PostGIS database will be connected to the commission's GIS Cloud platform. The final map will exclude broadband infrastructure layers and include generalized broadband infrastructure-poor areas based on ECC's reports, broadband infrastructure data, and feedback from the counties. This is very similar to what the NYS Department of Public Service will implement in May 2022. We will remove any sensitive information from the datasets shared publicly. We have sent a cybersecurity questionnaire—the Consensus Assessment Initiative Questionnaire—to GIS Cloud, to have even more assurance about the cybersecurity controls on their platform.

A Broadband Database

All the broadband data, including sensitive broadband infrastructure data for each county, will be stored in a separate PostGIS database, which is housed on East Coast servers. This separate PostGIS database will include broadband infrastructure data for the 11 counties, e-911 address points for the 11 counties, U.S. Department of Agriculture's Rural Digital Opportunity Fund winning broadband bidders in New York State, broadband target areas according to final ECC county reports, and census data by census block (e.g., population, median household income, and number of household). Other datasets may be included upon request. Each broadband partner will receive unique credentials to access the data within the PostGIS broadband database. Upon making connection to the PostGIS database using these unique credentials, partners can add the broadband data to ArcMap, QGIS, or in any other GIS software.

Cybersecurity Considerations

On August 2, 2021, the NYS Tug Hill Commission met with New York State's Division of Homeland Security & Emergency Services, Office of Counter Terrorism, to address cybersecurity concerns related

to hosting sensitive broadband infrastructure data offshores. On August 9, 2021, our counsel provided us feedback on several cybersecurity concerns that we had. Considering these concerns and recommendations from both the Office of Counter Terrorism and our legal counsel, the commission decided against using GIS Cloud's web feature services for hosting the sensitive broadband infrastructure data. Rather we will only use GIS Cloud for our public-facing map, which will not include the sensitive broadband infrastructure data. Furthermore, since PostGIS is hosted on servers in the United States, they comply with national cybersecurity standards for hosting sensitive infrastructure data onshore. Furthermore, the data will be password-protected further strengthening our broadband cybersecurity posture.

Input from NYS Department of Public Service

We met on June 2, 2021, with NYS Department of Public Service—the Empire State Development Broadband Program Office also sat in on the call—to discuss their plans for broadband mapping. They are following a similar data collection process to our own with ECC Technologies, Inc. They plan to have their reports and maps live in May 2022. Currently, they are brainstorming templates for their public-facing map. They suggested that we keep our mapping efforts active even after their map goes live so that we can make quicker updates when necessary and they can use our service as a point of reference.

Information and Data Request

The commission is collecting each counties' infrastructure data to share with all partners in the password-protected broadband database and to create the broadband target areas for the public-facing map. We are also accepting any geospatial and other data related to the Broadband Affordability and Adoption Tool (BAAT) survey results. The BAAT data can be used to improve the creation of broadband target areas. If there are any other broadband-related datasets that you would like the commission to host in the broadband database, please let us know what those datasets may be and what restrictions you would like to place on those datasets. All these datasets can be email to Katie Malinowski, Executive Director at the Tug Hill Commission, katie@tughill.org, along with the signed data sharing agreement.

In summary, the commission has taken in partners' feedback and concerns to provide final products that are user-friendly and have a strong cybersecurity posturing. You are welcome to use both resources, however access to the broadband database requires the submission of a signed data sharing agreement. The public-facing map will be similar to New York State Public Service Commission's public-facing map, which will be released in May 2022. Any broadband-related datasets that you wish to include in the shared broadband database can be emailed to Katie Malinowski, katie@tughill.org. Both broadband database and mapping products will launch on October 29. Any new or updated datasets will be added as they become available. Any questions, comments, or concerns can also be directed to Alaina Mallette, Planner, alaina@tughill.org.

Thank you for your participation in this important initiative. The commission looks forward to seeing broadband expand in our 11 counties.


Re: Recommendations for fund balance overage and Reserves

This recommendation is designed to accomplish the following Goals:

- Comply with the County's Fund Balance Policy in 2021 and 2022.
- Restore our Reserve Funds to fiscally responsible levels.
- Reduce the amount the County will need to borrow for the Courts and Bunner Street projects.

Background

While Oswego County's overall financial situation is very good, it's Reserve funds have diminished to an historically low level of \$4.7 million, to a point where they would be insufficient to handle a significant unanticipated need or economic downturn. The County has historically needed to maintain reserves between \$11 million and \$16 million. Fortunately, this situation can be remedied and the County set on a favorably stable financial course because the County ended 2020 with a high unappropriated fund balance (UFB).



The County's fund balance policy (PRP 2018-23) requires the Budget Officer to develop a remediation plan, in consultation with the Chairman and Treasurer, if the UFB exceeds 15% of the budget. The 2020 UFB was \$41.9 million or 19.7%. The County has allocated \$8.5 million

of UFB during 2021, lowering the percentage to 15.7%. However, current indicators suggest the County will end 2021 with another high UFB. Sales tax revenue alone is trending \$11 million higher than budgeted, once again placing the UFB well above the 15% threshold (est. 20%).

Recommendation:

Transfer \$7.4 million from the UFB to selected Reserves, based on projected future costs and the County's historical need and usage of Reserves. This will raise the Reserves to \$12.1 million.

The rationale for these amounts is based on the following:

- Next-year and multi-year capital plans identified in 2022 departmental budget requests.
- The County still relies heavily on Reserves to fund bridges, building construction and renovation, and technology projects.
- In recent years the County has funded certain annual capital projects in the budget, creating less reliance on road and auto Reserves.

Assuming the 2021 estimated fund balance projections are correct, moving these funds into Reserves should result in a UFB that is 15% to 18% of the 2022 budget. Reducing the UFB in 2022 can be accomplished by using UFB (and potentially ARPA funds) toward the Public Safety Center expansion and Bunner Street renovation projects. This will have the dual benefit of reducing UFB to below 15% and reducing the amount needed to bond for these projects.

Going forward, the County should continue with its practice of paying for unanticipated expenses and capital projects by using these sources in the following order:

- 1. Operating budget
- 2. Unappropriated fund balance
- 3. ARPA (where eligible)
- 4. Reserves
- 5. Debt financing.

RESOLUTION NO. 312

RESOLUTION OPPOSING THE NEW YORK ENERGY RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (NYSERDA) PROPOSAL TO FACILITATE THE SITING OF WIND TOWERS (GREAT LAKES OFFSHORE WIND PROJECT) IN LAKE ONTARIO

By Legislator Tim Stahl:

WHEREAS, NYSERDA has been directed by the New York State Public Service Commission (Commission) to conduct a study of the feasibility of developing offshore wind energy in the Great Lakes adjacent to New York State.; and

WHEREAS, the Commission instructs NYSERDA to conduct a feasibility study of Great Lakes wind energy to consider the environmental, maritime, economic, and social issues as well as market barriers and costs of developing wind in the Great Lakes as an important step toward assessing the overall value and viability of this potential resource; and

WHEREAS, NYSERDA has engaged three contractors to conduct the various analyses comprising the Great Lakes Wind Feasibility Study which began in February 2021 and is expected to be completed by the end of that year; and

WHEREAS, topics covered by the study included a review of environmental conditions, regulatory processes, available technologies, grid interconnectivity, port use and business opportunities, current lake uses, and social impacts among others; and

WHEREAS, to the best of our knowledge no local government officials from any community along the Lake Ontario shoreline in Oswego and perhaps other lakeshore counties, was contacted directly by any of NYSERDA's contractors and questioned about this initiative and its potential impacts on their communities; and

WHEREAS, NYSERDA's maps of potential sites for said turbines include significant portions of Oswego County's scenic and economically and environmentally sensitive Lake Ontario shoreline; and

WHEREAS, public presentations detailing the studies preformed reveal the no significant consideration was given to the impact of these facilities on the tens of thousands of raptors whose annual migration corridor will be littered with these deadly structures; and

WHEREAS, New York State, local communities and small business owners across the entire Lake Ontario shoreline have invested hundreds of millions of dollars to develop and participate in a world class fishery visited annually by anglers from throughout America and around the world, and

WHEREAS, electromagnetic fields surrounding underwater transmission cables are known to exist and disrupt the migratory habits of various aquatic species yet presentations by NYSERDA and their consultants also reveal that no effort was given to examine these impacts on King, Atlantic or Coho salmon or any other game fish that are the foundation of the Lake Ontario fishery; and

WHEREAS, said project will have a negative impact on many Oswego County landowners, homeowners, and businesses, including potential effects on real estate values, scenic vistas, quality of life, and the tourism, hospitality and recreation industry; and

WHEREAS, the economies of New York State and Oswego County are heavily reliant upon the Lake Ontario sport fishery and the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation estimates the total "economic contribution of all spending for sportfishing" in Oswego County (2017) to be approximately \$192,734,697 and supporting nearly 1,000 jobs; and

WHEREAS, the areas in Lake Ontario that are proposed for these turbines are some of the best sportfishing grounds in the lake and it is highly likely that there will be vast restrictions on the use of the waters surrounding the proposed turbines, and

WHEREAS, in the proposed tower areas of Lakes Erie and Ontario numerous submerged cultural resources exist for which New York State is responsible to protect and provide public access under the Abandoned Shipwreck Act of 1987, and construction of wind towers will likely limit access to these historic resources for research and recreational purposes, and may pose a threat of destruction of these resources, and

WHEREAS, the proposed wind tower construction areas directly abut the Eastern Lake Ontario dune, barrier beach and wetland system, which has been identified as a "unique and irreplaceable" natural coastal area by the New York State Department of State, and designated a "Natural Heritage Area" by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, and such construction could have unknown significant negative impacts on the natural process that maintain this rare natural coastal resource; and

WHEREAS, no financial benefit will accrue to any municipality within Oswego County, because the facilities will be exempt from local real property taxes; and

WHEREAS, the project will require the construction of transmission facilities which would result in a negative economic impact on tourism destinations due to the effect on scenic vistas, and depending on their locations, could also negatively affect the farming community; and

WHEREAS, Oswego County does not wish to be the location of experimental off-shore wind tower technology that we believe will have significant negative environmental and economic impacts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Oswego County Legislature encourages and welcomes job-creating economic development projects, business expansions, and new businesses in the County that are consistent with our communities' values, enhance quality of life, and present no harm to the unique characteristics of this County that we all cherish, however we feel this project is inconsistent with our community goals and so we strongly oppose the plans by NYSERDA and the Public Service Commission to place wind turbines anywhere in Lake Ontario but in particular in the East Basin of the Lake; and be it further

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

By and Between the

County of Oswego (hereinafter referred to as "County")

And the

Civil Service Employees Association, Inc.

County of Oswego
Office of Personnel Unit 8000
Oswego County Local 838
(hereinafter referred to as "CSEA")

WHEREAS, the County and the Union are parties to a Collective Bargaining Agreement for a term which expired on December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Union have been engaged in collective bargaining which has led to a mutual understanding between the County and the Union for the terms and conditions of employment for a Successor Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Union are desirous of reducing that mutual understanding to a written document.

NOW, THEREFORE, the County and the Union agree as follows:

- 1. All terms and conditions of the existing Collective Bargaining Agreement shall continue in full force and effect unless specifically modified by this Memorandum of Agreement and/or the terms of the expired Agreement.
- 2. This Memorandum of Agreement is subject to ratification by the membership of the Union and by the Oswego County Legislature.

3. Section 21.1 "Compensation Rate" shall be amended by deleting the existing language and inserting the following (Appendix A and E-H attached):

<u>Increases</u>

Effective January 1, 2021 - 2.50% increase

Effective January 1, 2022 - A new grade plan will be implemented in Appendix A and F to be effective January 1, 2022

Effective January 1, 2023 - 3.00% increase

Effective January 1, 2024 - 3.00% increase

4. Amend current language in Article 14.2 requiring Medicare Advantage with Prescription Drug Plan at retirement.

14.2 <u>Health Insurance</u>

A. The County agrees to provide to all full-time employees including full-time temporary employees, a health insurance plan covering medical and prescription drug benefits as outlined in Appendix L.

This coverage commences the first day of the month following a thirty (30) day period of full-time employment with Oswego County.

Health insurance plan shall be continued at current level of benefits for the life of this contract.

County retains the right to select and/or change third-party administrator or purchase coverage from a commercial carrier.

B. The employee co-pay for each prescription will be as follows:

	Retail (30-day supply)	Mail (90-day supply)
Generic	\$10	\$10
Preferred	\$20	\$30
Non-Preferred	\$40	\$75

Drug Importation

If drug importation is deemed legal and approved by the FDA during the term of this Labor Agreement, the County agrees to undertake a study to determine potential cost savings in preparation for subsequent contract negotiations. This information on cost savings will be reviewed by the Labor-Management Committee.

C. Each employee enrolled in the health insurance plan will contribute 6% of the individual premium equivalent with the County paying the balance. Employees hired on or after May 1, 2012 will continue to contribute 15% of the individual premium equivalent, on a bi-weekly basis with the County paying the balance.

Employees may extend this coverage to their dependents. Cost of dependent coverage will be paid seventy-five (75) percent by the County and twenty-five (25) percent by the employee.

D. Upon obtaining County retirement status, medical and prescription drug coverage will be provided subject to the following:

The County will pay the premium for the retirees' insurance as described in 1 and 2 below:

- 1. If the retiree is not yet Medicare eligible, medical and prescription drug coverage is offered through a county sponsored plan.
 - --Retirees not yet Medicare eligible are required to pay 100% of the cost of prescription drug coverage unless offset in accordance with Article 10.4 B.
 - --Retirees with dependents who are not yet Medicare eligible will pay 100% of the cost for dependent medical and prescription drug coverage unless offset in accordance with Article 10.4 B.
- 2. If the retiree is eligible for Medicare, medical and prescription drug coverage is provided through a plan that is specifically designed for Medicare eligibles, conditional upon the retiree's enrollment in Medicare Parts A and B.
 - --Retirees who are Medicare eligible and were hired prior to August 11, 2016 will be required to pay 35% of the cost of the medical and prescription drug premium equivalent rate in effect for Medicare eligibles unless offset in accordance with Article 10.4 B.
 - --Employees hired after August 11, 2016 who are eligible to receive health insurance upon retirement will, upon becoming Medicare eligible, contribute 50% of the cost of the medical and prescription drug premium equivalent rate in effect for Medicare eligibles unless offset in accordance with Article 10.4 B.
 - --Retirees with dependents who are Medicare eligible will pay 100% of the cost for dependent coverage of the medical and prescription drug premium equivalent rate in effect for Medicare eligibles unless offset in accordance with Article 10.4.B.

Nothing contained within this section is intended to conflict or be interpreted inconsistent with the insurance contracts entered into by the County.

For employees hired on or after May 1, 2012, provisions in 14.2 (D) above will apply only if employee has completed 10 years of continuous full-time service to Oswego County. Part-time equivalent service will count toward the requirement provided the employee is employed in full-time status at the time of retirement.

- E. Part-time employees that meet the definition of part-time as defined in 16.3 of the Labor Agreement shall be allowed to enroll for either single or family coverage. Part-time employees enrolling will be required to pay 100% of cost for coverage purchased.
- F. For deductibles, see Appendix L.
- G. Physical & Wellness Exams

Refer to the Summary Plan Description for County of Oswego Health Benefit Plan.

H. Employee Assistance Program (EAP)

The County agrees to provide an Employee Assistance Program (EAP). The EAP will be available to all Union members and their eligible dependents.

5. Amend current language in Article 21.6, Promotion, to include other pay rate adjustments and re-name article to accurately reflect contents.

21.6 Promotion and Other Pay Rate Adjustments

A. When an employee is appointed to a higher grade on a provisional, temporary, or permanent basis, the employee's salary will be increased by the cumulative percentage difference between the base of employee's present grade and the employee's new grade.

Employees at the start rate or end of first-year job rate will be placed on the step in the new grade. Employees not on a specific step will receive the percentage.

Percentage Difference Between Grades:

- 1-4 4 percent 4-9 6 percent 9-15 8 percent
- B. When an employee hired after 4/12/01 assumes a lower grade position, the employee's rate of pay will be the job rate for the lower grade position. Any longevity will be added to the job rate.

- C. When a probationary employee returns to a lower grade position for which they most recently held, the employee's rate of pay will be their previous rate of pay plus any applicable annual percentage increase if not already included in the previous rate.
- D. When a current County employee under a different bargaining agreement accepts a position under this agreement, the employee's rate of pay will be the job rate for the position provided there is no break in service. Longevity for continuous years of County employment will be added to the job rate.

6. Amend current language in Article 2, Equal Employment Opportunity, to reflect current Equal Employment Opportunity Statement.

Acknowledging the moral principles inherent in Federal and State Legislation, the parties to this Agreement hereby affirm that they shall ensure equal employment opportunities for all qualified individuals without consideration of their sex (including self-identified or perceived sex, gender identity, gender expression, and transgender status), race (and traits historically associated with race, including, but not limited to, hair texture or protective hairstyles), color, religion (including the wearing of any attire, clothing, or facial hair in accordance with the requirements of one's religion), creed, national origin, age, disability (including pregnancy related conditions), sexual orientation, marital status, familial status, military status, genetic information or predisposing genetic characteristics, prior arrest or conviction record, domestic violence victim status, or any other class protected by law.

It is furthermore affirmed the concept and philosophy of equal opportunities shall be provided for, but not restricted to, all components of employment, recruitment, selection, assignment, compensation, benefits, promotion and training.

7. Amend current language in Article 21.8 to reflect current departmental practices and increase monthly stipend effective January 1, 2022.

21.8 Special Services (Probation) Extra Payment

An employee authorized by the Probation Director to carry a firearm and is assigned to the Special Services Unit to perform special services functions, will receive a \$50 per month stipend after meeting a minimum threshold of carrying a firearm for 10 hours/month. Effective January 1, 2022, employees will receive a \$100 per month stipend after meeting a minimum threshold of carrying a firearm for 10 hours/month.

Employees assigned to Special Services will receive a \$500.00 annual uniform allowance. It is understood that this allowance shall be used for the replacement of uniforms after the initial issuance of a uniform. If the County changes uniform color, design, etc., an initial issuance of the new uniform will be the County's responsibility. The employee will use the annual uniform allowance to replace and maintain initial uniform issues. It is understood that this allowance is not to replace the County's

obligation to provide equipment such as weapons, bulletproof vests and other similar equipment.

8. Amend current language in Article 3.2, Payroll and Payroll Deductions, to include deductions for union sponsored insurance premiums.

The County shall deduct from the wages of each employee and remit to the Civil Service Employees Association, Inc., in the manner and form approved by the Union, regular membership dues, health, accident, life, and union-sponsored insurance premiums for those employees who have signed authorizations permitting such payroll deductions.

9. Amend current language in Article 3.1, Membership, to include reflect changes in deductions for membership dues based on June 2018 Janus decision.

Membership in the Union shall be voluntary, but since it is recognized that a strong and active Union with full membership and participation on the part of the employees is desirable for the collective bargaining process, the County agrees there shall be no discrimination, interference, restraint or coercion by the county or any of its agents against any employee because of membership in the Union or because of any activities on behalf of the Union.

The Civil Service Employees Association, Inc. having been recognized or certified as the exclusive representative of employees within the bargaining unit represented by this Agreement shall have dues deducted from the wage or salary of employees of said bargaining unit who are members of the Civil Service Employees Association, Inc. The employer shall make such deductions and transmit the amount so deducted along with a listing of such employees to Civil Service Employees Association, Inc., 143 Washington Avenue Albany, NY 12210 on a payroll basis.

10. Amend current language in Article 16.5 (6), Layoff Rights, to update Human Resources Website.

Laid off employees are encouraged to frequently check the County Website, <u>oswegocounty.com/humanresources</u> or check the bulletin board at the Human Resources Department for any posted job openings and postings. Applicants meeting the minimum qualifications will be considered along with other applicants in accordance with the Labor Agreement.

11. Amend current language in Article 5.3, Union Rights, to restrict release of members' Social Security number.

The County shall supply to the Unit President the following information on a quarterly basis:

1. A list of all employees in the bargaining unit, including name, home address, last 4 digits of social security number, job code and title, position number, membership status, insurance deduction and start date.

12. Amend current language in second paragraph of Article 10.4 to reflect current practices.

10.4 Sick Leave Credit

Upon employee's retirement under the New York State Employees' Retirement System, an employee shall have the following options:

- A. Unused sick leave shall be applied to an employee's years of service in accordance with the provisions of section 41 J of the New York State Retirement Law.
- B. After applying for retirement, and upon completion of the Request to Bank Sick Leave Form provided to you by the Human Resources Department, cash equivalent of 75% of sick time accrued as of date of retirement may be banked. Cash value will be calculated by multiplying total sick hours accrued by hourly rate as of the date of retirement multiplied by 75%. Money so banked shall be used to offset cost of retiree's or dependent's health insurance and/or a prescription drug card. In the event a retiree dies prior to exhausting available funds, the remainder may be used to pay premiums for any COBRA benefits available to and selected by the retiree's dependents.

13. Amend current language in Article 11.2, Bereavement Leave, to reflect changes in Civil Rights Law.

11.2 Bereavement Leave

Bereavement leave shall be granted to an employee for use upon the death of a relative as follows: Mother, Father, Husband, Wife, Son, Daughter, Sister, Brother, Grandfather, Grandmother, Granddaughter, Grandson, or same-sex committed partner. The above terms shall include natural, step, and in-law relations. The leave shall be limited to twenty-one (21) paid hours (3 days) for employees working seven (7) hours per day and twenty-four (24) paid hours (3 days) for an employee working eight (8) or more hours per shift. Same sex committed partners are defined as those who are financially and emotionally interdependent in a manner commonly presumed of spouses.

Employees at 911 working twelve (12) hour shifts shall receive twenty-four (24) hours (2 days) of bereavement leave.

Employees that meet the requirement for part-time status as defined in 16.3 of the labor agreement shall be granted bereavement leave. Part-time employees will be paid for hours that would have normally been scheduled.

Bereavement leave shall be limited to scheduled workdays and may include the day after the funeral, delayed interment, and/or memorial service. An employee may request additional annual leave or time without pay if needed.

14. Amend Section 21.4 – Shift Differential, effective January 1, 2022 to read as follows:

21.4 Shift Differential

An employee whose major part of a working day falls between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. on a regular basis will be paid fifty (50) cents per hour shift premium. Effective January 1, 2022, employees will be paid one dollar (\$1.00) per hour shift premium. The major part of a working day is defined as fifty percent or more of the employee's hours.

An employee who is not regularly scheduled to work between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. will be entitled to the shift premium only when filling in for an absent employee whose regularly scheduled hours are between 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

15. Amend Section 21.5 – On-Call Premium, effective January 1, 2022 to read as follows:

21.5 On-Call Premium

Effective January 1, 2017, mandatory on-call duty by an employee will be compensated at a rate of \$60 per 24-hour day for Friday, Saturday, Sunday, holidays and the day prior to holidays. All weekdays other than Friday or the day before a holiday will be compensated at the rate of \$50 per 16-hour day. Effective January 1, 2022, mandatory on-call duty by an employee will be compensated at a rate of \$100 per 24-hour day for Friday, Saturday, Sunday, holidays and the day prior to holidays. All weekdays other than Friday or the day before a holiday will be compensated at the rate of \$75 per 16-hour day.

Should the tour of on-call duty be less than the previously stipulated hours the premium will be prorated on an hourly calculation.

In the event the on-call employee is actually called out, they will receive pay at their normal hourly rate of pay for actual hours worked or two (2) hours at their normal hourly rate of pay, whichever is greater. Employees called out between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. will receive pay at their normal hourly rate for hours worked or three (3) hours at their normal hourly rate of pay, whichever is greater.

Employees who are assigned to be on call and are required to use the telephone in the performance of county business will be paid for time worked at their normal hourly rate of pay rounded to the nearest 1/4 hour upon submission of an approved time form.

Any employee placed on mandatory on-call for a 24-hour period during any holiday as enumerated in this Agreement will receive a compensatory day off or a day's pay at their normal hourly rate of pay at the discretion of the department head.

In the event the on-call employee is actually called out during any holiday enumerated in this Agreement, they will receive time and one-half $(1\ 1/2)$ for all hours actually worked.

16. Effective January 1, 2022, amend Section 13.2 as follows:

13.2 Meals and Lodging

Reimbursement for meals and lodging expense shall be allowed for an employee on official business, outside the limits of Oswego County, or attending authorized conferences or meetings within the County with the prior approval of the department head.

Reimbursement shall be allowed based on claims for meals and lodging expenses supported by receipts showing the amount, date and location. Partial per day expense will be reimbursed at reasonable and appropriate rates upon the authorization of the department head but shall not exceed the total. Lodging requests supported by receipts will be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses.

Reimbursement shall be made in accordance with the Federally regulated U.S. General Services Administration listed daily amounts.

17. Amend first paragraph of Section 10.4 – Sick Leave Credit, effective January 1, 2022 to read as follows:

An employee will earn sick leave credit at the rate of seven (7) hours with pay for each one-hundred fifty-one (151) hours of employment; not to exceed annual earnings of eighty-four (84) hours. Comparable credit will be provided forty-hour employees on a prorated basis to a maximum of ninety-six (96) hours. Employees hired between December 8, 2005 and April 30, 2012 will earn seven (7) hours for each one hundred eighty two (182) hours of employment, not to exceed annual earnings of seventy (70) hours. (Eighty (80) hour per pay period employees will be prorated accordingly.) Employees hired on or after May 1, 2012 will earn seven (7) hours for each two hundred twenty seven and one half (227.5) hours of employment not to exceed annual earnings of fifty six (56) hours. (Employees working eighty hours per pay period will be prorated

accordingly, not to exceed sixty four hours). Effective January 1, 2022, employees hired on or after May 1, 2012 will earn seven (7) hours for each one hundred eighty two (182) hours of employment, not to exceed annual earnings of seventy (70) hours. (Eighty (80) hour per pay period employees will be prorated accordingly.)

Sick leave credits may be accumulated to a maximum of 1400 hours. Sick leave credit exceeding the maximum shall be of no benefit to the employee. This clause defines the method of accruing sick leave credit and does not establish a minimum standard use.

18. Amend Section 10.8 – Sick Leave Part-Time Employees, effective January 1, 2022 to read as follows:

10.8 Sick Leave Part-Time Employees

Employees that meet the requirements for part-time as defined in 16.3 of the agreement will earn sick time at a rate of seven (7) hours for each 151 hours of employment. Part-time employees hired between December 8, 2005 and April 30, 2012 will earn seven (7) hours for each 182 hours of employment. Employees hired on or after May 1, 2012 will earn seven (7) hours for each two hundred twenty seven and one half (227.5) hours of employment not to exceed annual earnings of fifty six (56) hours. Effective January 1, 2022, employees hired on or after May 1, 2012 will earn seven (7) hours for each 182 hours of employment.

Part-time employees will not be allowed to receive pay for more hours than would have normally been scheduled.

19. Amend first and third paragraph of Section 9.2 – Annual Leave Credit, effective January 1, 2023 to read as follows:

An employee shall earn annual leave in accordance with the following schedule. Entitlement is based upon years of service and scheduled hours worked. No additional entitlement is earned for premium or overtime hours worked. Effective January 1, 2023 employees hired on or after May 1, 2012 will be restored to original earnings table to equal those employees hired prior to May 1, 2012.

Employees that qualify for part-time status as defined in 16.3 of the labor agreement will earn leave credit at a rate of seven (7) paid hours per 151.7 hours worked (35-hour workweek) or at a rate of eight (8) paid hours per 173.3 hours worked (40-hour workweek), not to exceed 12 days. Employees hired on or after May 1, 2012 will earn leave credit at a rate of seven (7) paid hours per 182 hours worked (35-hour workweek) or at a rate of eight (8) paid hours per 208 hours worked (40-hour workweek), not to exceed 10 days. After working 6,000 hours, part-time employees will earn annual leave credit at a rate of seven

(7) paid hours per 121.3 hours worked (35-hour workweek) or at the rate of eight (8) paid hours per 138.6 hours worked (40-hour workweek) not to exceed 15 days or 105 hours for 35-hour workweek employees or 120 hours for 40hour workweek employees. After working 6,000 hours, part-time employees hired on or after May 1, 2012 will earn annual leave credit at a rate of seven (7) paid hours per 140 hours worked (35-hour workweek) or at the rate of eight (8) paid hours per 160 hours worked (40-hour workweek) not to exceed 13 days or 91 hours for 35-hour workweek employees or 104 hours for 40-hour workweek employees. Effective January 1, 2023 employees hired on or after May 1, 2012 will earn leave credit at a rate of seven (7) paid hours per 151.7 hours worked (35-hour workweek) or at a rate of eight (8) paid hours per 173.3 hours worked (40-hour workweek), not to exceed 12 days. Effective January 1, 2023, after working 6,000 hours, part-time employees hired on or after May 1, 2012 will earn annual leave credit at a rate of seven (7) paid hours per 121.3 hours worked (35-hour workweek) or at the rate of eight (8) paid hours per 138.6 hours worked (40-hour workweek) not to exceed 15 days or 105 hours for 35hour workweek employees or 120 hours for 40-hour workweek employees.

Purpose:

The COVID-19 pandemic has placed considerable demands upon the Oswego County Health Department and its staff. Extending a temporary on-call premium is necessary to meet the operational demands of the department.

As any change to the terms or method of compensation must be ratified by both the Union and the County Legislature, a tentative Memorandum of Understanding was reached by the Union and County (attached) pending approval by both parties. This is to request approval by the Oswego County Legislature to authorize execution of the agreement.

Summary:

The Resolution for approval refers to the "attached" MOU agreement. That document will be part of the official public document.

Recommended Action:

To authorize execution and extend the temporary Memorandum of Understanding with the Oswego County Professional Association (OCPA) until June 30, 2022.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BY AND BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF OSWEGO AND THE OSWEGO COUNTY PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION (OCPA)

On Call Premium

The collective bargaining agreement (CBA) by and between the County of Oswego and the Oswego County Professional Association (OCPA) includes language in Article 21.4 regarding the payment of an on-call premium and identifies the Supervising Public Health Nurse (SPHN) title as eligible for this compensation. The provision of an on call premium to the titles of Director of Environmental Health (DEH) and Director of Patient Services (DPS) was not agreed upon as part of the OCPA bargaining agreement.

This Memorandum of Understanding is made to extend the provision of the on-call premium to the current DEH and DPS on a temporary, short term basis due to COVID-19 response, current staffing levels and departmental operational needs.

The DEH and DPS shall only be paid the on-call premium when on call duty is mandated by the Public Health Director and the DEH and DPS are required to serve in the on call rotation with other Environmental or Nursing Health Division employees to satisfy operation needs of the Divisions. The premium shall be paid only when the DEH and DPS are scheduled and approved for, and has worked on-call hours, with the actual pay rates and call out pay being the same as the rates in Article 21.4, applying to SPHNs.

The Director of Environmental Health and Director of Patient Services are not obligated under this MOU to cover the on call scheduled for other Environmental or Nursing Health Division employees unless mandated by the Public Health Director. The Director of Public Health retains the right to assign the on call hours to Environmental or Nursing Health Division employees as dictated by operational needs.

This MOU extends the MOU dated June 10, 2021, is effective immediately and will terminate June 30, 2022.

Further, this MOU is limited to the specific employees in the titles above at the present time and for the operational reasons as stated, including the COVID-19 response and does not set precedent regarding these titles, Article 21.4, on call premiums, and shall in no way bind the County or OCPA in any future matters. Even should identical factors occur in the future, no similar result may occur and no agreement may be reached.
