RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO SENATE BILL S7855 AS IT RELATES TO THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE WESTERN REGIONAL OFF-TRACK BETTING CORPORATION

WHEREAS, Western Region Off-Track Betting Corporation (WROTB) is a public benefit corporation with headquarters in Batavia, New York, and

WHEREAS, WROTB is owned and operated by 15 Western New York counties and the cities of Rochester and Buffalo, and

WHEREAS, the corporation owns and operates 11 off-track betting branches, 27 E-Z Bet locations and a telephone wagering service in 15 Western New York counties, as well as Batavia Downs Gaming, a standard bred racetrack and gaming facility, and

WHEREAS, since its inception, Western OTB has generated over \$250 million in operating and surcharge revenues to the taxpayers of those participating municipalities, and

WHEREAS, throughout its long history of serving the 15 counties and two cities that comprise the corporation, the Board of Directors of WROTB has been comprised of one representative from each of the 17 municipalities, and

WHEREAS, in 1973, the Oswego County Legislature passed by resolution legislation that authorized and empowered Oswego County to participate in the WROTB that had recently been created by the state and signed by then Governor Nelson Rockefeller, and

WHEREAS, the 1973 legislation passed by the Oswego County Legislature was passed with the stipulation that it was "subject to permissive referendum and shall become effective in accordance with Section 24 of the Municipal Home Rule Law of the State of New York", and

WHEREAS, New York State Senator Timothy M. Kennedy (D - Buffalo) has recently proposed Senate Bill S7855, an act to "amend the racing, pari-mutuel wagering and breeding law, in relation to the membership of the Board of Directors of the Western Regional Off-Track Betting Corporation", and

WHEREAS, Sen. Kennedy's proposal calls for revising the current fair and equitable representation of the Board of Directors to three members to represent the counties of Monroe, Wyoming, and Orleans; a single member to represent the counties of Chautauqua, Cayuga, Genesee, Livingston, Schuyler, and Seneca; four members to represent Erie County; one member to represent Niagara County, a lone member to represent the counties of Oswego, Cattaraugus, and Wayne; one member to represent the City of Buffalo, one

member to represent the City of Rochester, one member appointed by the governor, one member appointed by the temporary president of the senate, and one member appointed by the speaker of the assembly, and

WHEREAS, Sen. Kennedy's bill states that its intent is to "provide more equal representation of the people of the area who benefit from proceeds from said corporation", and

WHEREAS, this legislation will in fact have the opposite effect of the stated intention in the bill, as it will decimate the balanced representation formula determined previously by both the state legislature and governor as equitable and impartial, with a clear and explicit intent of providing each municipality that comprises the corporation an equal voice in WROTB matters, and,

WHEREAS, the performance and accomplishments of the current WROTB Board and leadership cannot be discounted when considering this drastic and overreaching legislation, including, but not limited to: the acquisition of an 84-room hotel on the grounds of Batavia Downs that has drawn rave reviews, countless fundraising events for charitable organizations that have benefitted thousands of families across western New York, including Make-A-Wish, the Batavia Police Department K-9 Unit, the Genesee County K-9 Unit, GLOW YMCA, Food Bank of Western New York, and the Breast Cancer Coalition of Rochester, and

WHEREAS, in 2021, Batavia Downs once again shattered attendance and wager records, with more than 625,000 attendees wagering nearly \$700 million this past year alone, leading to record earnings distributions for the 17 municipalities that have come to rely on their WROTB distributions to balance their local budgets while reducing the property tax burden for businesses and homeowners, and

WHEREAS, the current WROTB Board and leadership have successfully led the corporation through in incredibly difficult period in history, the Covid-19 pandemic, that has ravaged similar entities across the state and the country, and

WHEREAS, WROTB currently has 385 full- and part-time employees with a payroll of \$12.5 million; individuals and families from every corner of our region, and all whom could be negatively impacted by this drastic proposal, therefore be it

RESOLVED, Oswego County Legislature does vehemently oppose Senate Bill S7855, as it will cause irreparable harm to Oswego County, its interests in WROTB, the economic interests of Oswego County, and the taxpayers of this county, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Oswego County Legislature does hereby call upon members of the New York State Senate to reject S7855, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of this Legislature shall forward this resolution to Governor Kathy Hochul, Senator Patti Ritchie, Senator Timothy Kennedy, Assemblyman William Barclay, and Assemblyman Brian Manktelow.

AN ACT to amend the racing, pari-mutuel wagering and breeding law, in relation to the membership of the board of directors of the western regional off-track betting corporation

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The racing, pari-mutuel wagering and breeding law is 2 amended by adding a new section 502-a to read as follows:

§ 502-a. Special provisions with regard to the western regional off-3 track betting corporation. Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of this article, on the effective date of this section the term of each board member of the western regional off-track betting corporation, or any vacant position, shall be deemed expired, and each such board member or vacant position shall be replaced with the new appointments made pursuant to this section. The western off-track betting corporation board of directors shall be composed of fifteen members to be appointed as follows: three members to represent the counties of Monroe, Wyoming, and Orleans; one member to represent the counties of Chautaugua, Cayuga, Genesee, Livingston, Schuyler, and Seneca; four members to represent 13 Erie county; one member to represent Niagara county; one member to 15 represent the counties of Oswego, Cattaraugus, and Wayne; one member to represent the city of Buffalo; one member to represent the city of 17 Rochester; one member appointed by the governor; one member appointed by the temporary president of the senate; and one member appointed by the 19 speaker of the assembly. In the case of counties making joint appointments, such counties shall collaborate to select board members and shall 20 appoint such members through joint resolutions passed by such counties' 21 county legislature or board of supervisors. 22

§ 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after it shall have become a law, provided, however, that effective immediately municipalities may take any action necessary to begin the selection and appointment process for new board member terms pursuant to this act.

Subject:

Proposal to pass local law relating to income limits for Senior Exemptions

Background:

Currently, Oswego County offers eligible low-income homeowners aged 65 and older a 50% exemption on their County Real Property taxes. This exemption is authorized under section 467 of Real Property Tax Law. Oswego County originally granted this exemption in 1968 and has since adopted several local options to amend this exemption such as offering a higher base maximum income ceiling and sliding scale that offers increased income limits at proportionally lower exemption benefits. There are 1,016 senior households currently benefitting from this exemption.

This income limit was last increased by resolution 74 of 1999 to set the maximum benefit income ceiling at \$16,025 (50% exemption) allowing for a sliding scale benefit up to a maximum income of \$24,425 (5% exemption).

Proposal:

Real Property Tax Law allows the County to set the maximum income ceiling as high as \$29,000. If the income ceiling were to be increased to this maximum the sliding scale would update to allow for an income up to \$37,400 and all current senior households benefitting from this exemption would begin receiving the maximum benefit. A potential 2,479 additional senior owned households could also see partial benefit from this exemption with a raised income limit.

This exemption has historically been amended by the passage of resolutions to increase the maximum income limit, but this should instead be adopted as a local law consistent with other local laws authorizing exemptions in Oswego County. As with other local laws a public hearing would need to be held before the local law is adopted.

Local Law:

To accomplish the increase in income limits for these exemptions a local law would need to pass:

This Local Law as proposed would set the Senior Exemption at the following sliding scale:

Additional Local Options:

Section 467 of Real Property Tax Law allows the taxing jurisdiction to include in their local law several other options as follows:

- A Allows an applicant who will turn 65 by December 31st to qualify (otherwise owner must be 65 upon March 1st).
- B Allows an applicant who has been previously granted the exemption in the prior year to have until Grievance Day to file rather than Taxable Status Day (March 1st).
- C Allows for unreimbursed medical expenses to be excluded as income for purposes of the exemption.
- D Allows for disability payments for veterans under Title 38 US Code to be excluded as income for purposes of the exemption.
- E Allows for exemption to apply for school purposes even if a school-age child attends public school and lives with the senior (otherwise exemption is disallowed if a school-age child lives with the senior).
- F Allows exemption for owner-occupied cooperative apartments.
- G Allows an owner who received the exemption for 5 consecutive years to no longer need to reapply, but must instead submit an affidavit attesting they are still eligible when making their payment for taxes (not submitting an affidavit removes the exemption).
- H Allows an applicant to have until Grievance Day to file if a death or illness of an immediate family member prevented timely filing by the applicant (affidavit from physician must be provided).
- I Allows an applicant to petition the assessor showing "good cause" as to why they failed to file an application or renewal by Taxable Status Day. Petition may be filed until the last day to pay taxes without penalty. May only be allowed if local option H is also allowed.

Currently Oswego County has adopted none of these local options. The Senior Exemption Local Law as proposed would adopt A, C, and D as described above.

Statement of Need:

For the purposes of this exemption "income" is inclusive of all income the household makes in the year with very few exclusions. Retirement pensions and social security fully count as income. Income limits for these exemptions were last adopted by Oswego County

in 1999. If you adjust the original sliding scale maximum of \$24,425 for inflation it would be \$44,680 today.

Fiscal Impact:

Value of Exemption

The value of the Senior exemption on the 2021 Assessment Rolls was \$24,866,895 which represents 0.27% of the County's total assessed value. If the higher limit were in place the total value for those same households would have been \$41,295,319 which represents 0.45% of the County's total assessed value.

Effect on Tax Rate

The 2022 generic tax rate was \$6.95 per thousand of assessed value. If the higher income ceiling were in effect the 2022 generic tax rate would have been \$6.97 per thousand of assessed value.

Senior Citizen's Exemption (aka Aged Exemption)

RPTL § 467 | 4180_

- Opt-in exemption for towns/schools
 - Oswego County initial opt-in: November, 1968
- Applies to primary residence only, not allowed in co-op apartments.
- Owner must be 65 years or older as of taxable status day. For school tax purposes, a school-age child must not be living with the senior. If eligible owner dies, surviving spouse must be at least 62 years old to continue exemption eligibility.
- Income based exemption. Uses combined income for all owners, includingspouse (even if they're not on the deed). Max income for 50% can range from \$3,000 to \$29,000 based on local option.

Exemption Amount (County Tax)

- Sliding Scale exemption based on income.
- Max. benefit: 50% reduction in assessed value
- Max sliding scale benefit: 5% reduction AV

Filing Requirement

- Form RP-467
- Income verification (tax return or income forms)
- Must file separately even if they meet income requirements when filing for EnhancedSTAR/IVP

Income Guidelines

- Includes all sources of income. "Taxable" amounts from income tax forms should not be used in most cases, such as for Social Security income ¹.
 - Excluded income sources are IRA Distributions, Welfare Payments, income from the federal Foster Grandparents Program, returns of capital, gifts, inheritances, and Nazi Persecution payments.
 - Income received by an owner in a nursing home is considered incomeonly to the extent it exceeds the amount paid to the nursing home²;
 - Proceeds from a reverse mortgage do not count as income³.

467 Local Options

Municipalities and Schools may opt in to any of the following local options defined in RPTL § 467:

- A Allows an applicant who will turn 65 by December 31st to qualify (otherwise owner must be 65 upon March 1st).
- B Allows an applicant who has been previously granted the exemption in the prior year to have until Grievance Day to file rather than Taxable Status Day (March 1st).
- C Allows for unreimbursed medical expenses to be excluded as income for purposes of the exemption.
- D Allows for disability payments for veterans under Title 38 US Code to be excluded as income for purposes of the exemption.
- E Allows for exemption to apply for school purposes even if a school-age child attends public school and lives with the senior (otherwise exemption is disallowed if a school-age child lives with the senior).
- F Allows exemption for owner-occupied cooperative apartments.
- G Allows an owner who received the exemption for 5 consecutive years to no longer need to reapply, but must instead submit an affidavit attesting they are still eligible when making their payment for taxes (not submitting an affidavit removes the exemption).

Income Ceiling

The maximum income ceiling (M) to receive full benefit (50%) is \$3,000. Each taxing jurisdiction may choose a higher income ceiling between \$3,000 and \$29,000. This income ceiling was last updated by the NYS legislature in 2009.

Sliding Scale

When opting into this exemption a taxing jurisdiction first selects a maximum income ceiling (M) and then further opts whether to allow for a "sliding scale" where the income ceiling may be increased while the percentage benefit proportionally decreases (down to 20%) and may be further extended down to 10% or 5%. The breakpoints are defined in RPTL § 467 and are currently:

COUNTY OF OSWEGO LOCAL LAW No.: OF 2022

A LOCAL LAW PROVIDING FOR THE PARTIAL TAX EXEMPTION OF CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY OWNED BY PERSONS 65 YEARS OF AGE OR OVER

BE IT ENACTED by the County Legislature of the County of Oswego as follows:

Section I. Title and Legislative Findings.

- (a) The Oswego County Legislature has, heretofore, by Resolution number 146 of 1990 enacted a partial property tax exemption for persons 65 years of age or older, based upon certain income qualifications, pursuant to Real Property Tax Law 467 with a maximum income level of \$12,525.
- (b) In 1999 the Oswego County Legislature, by Resolution after public hearing changed the income eligibility schedule regarding a partial tax exemption on property owned by persons 65 years or older.
- (c) By this local law, the County of Oswego wishes to establish higher income eligibility levels via a sliding scale for those 65 or older eligible to receive a partial exemption in accordance with Real Property Tax Law (RPTL)§ 467 and formalize the partial exemption under a local law.

Section 2. Partial Tax Exemption Granted Under RPTL §467

Real property owned by one or more persons, each of whom is sixty-five (65) years of age or over, or real property owned by husband and wife or by siblings, one of whom is sixty-five years of age or over, shall be exempt from taxation for county purposes up to a maximum of fifty per cent (50%) of the assessed value provided the owner(s) meet the qualifications set forth below. For the purposes of this local law, sibling shall mean a brother or a sister, whether related through half blood, whole blood or adoption. Any person otherwise qualifying under this section shall not be denied the exemption under this section if they become sixty-five years of age after the appropriate taxable status date and on or before December thirty-first (31st) of the same year.

Section 3. Income Qualifications.

- (a) The partial exemption to be granted hereunder shall be determined by the income of the owner or the combined income of the owners of the property for the income tax year immediately preceding the date of making application (hereinafter referred to individually or collectively as "income").
- (b) Income tax year shall mean the twelve-month period for which the owner or owners filed a federal personal income tax return for the year before the income tax year immediately preceding the date of application.
- (c) Where title is vested in either a husband or a wife, their combined income may not exceed such sum, except where the husband or wife, or ex-husband or ex-wife is absent from the property as provided in subparagraph (c)(2) of Section 4 of this local law, then only the income of the spouse or ex-spouse residing on the property shall be considered and may not exceed such sum.
- (d) Such income shall include Social Security and retirement benefits, interest, dividends, total gains from the sale or exchange of a capital asset which may be offset by a loss from the sale or exchange of a capital asset in the same income tax year, net rental income, salary or earnings, and net income from self-employment, but shall not include a return of capital, gifts, inheritances, and such other forms of income which are excluded under Real Property Tax Law § 467(3)(a), presently and as may be amended. Any such income shall be offset by all medical and prescription drug expenses actually paid by owner which were not reimbursed or paid for by insurance. The provisions of this paragraph notwithstanding, such income shall not include Veteran's disability compensation, as defined in Title 38 of the United States Code. In computing net rental income and net income from self-employment no depreciation deduction shall be allowed for the exhaustion, wear and tear of real or personal property held for the production of income.

Section 4. Additional Qualifications.

No exemption shall be granted hereunder unless:

(a) the owner shall have held an exemption under this section for his previous residence or unless the title of the property shall have been vested in the owner or one of the owners of the property for at least twelve consecutive months prior to the date of making application for exemption, provided, however, that in the event of the death of either a husband or wife in whose name title of the property shall have been vested at the time of death and then becomes vested solely in the survivor by virtue of devise by or descent from the deceased husband or wife, the time of ownership of the property by the deceased husband or wife shall be deemed also a time of ownership by the survivor and such ownership shall be deemed continuous for the purposes of computing such period of twelve consecutive months, In the event of a transfer by either a husband or wife to the other spouse of all or part of the title to the property, the time of ownership of the

property by the transferor spouse shall be deemed also a time of ownership by the transferee spouse and such ownership shall be deemed continuous for the purposes of computing such period of twelve consecutive months. Where property of the owner or owners has been acquired to replace property formerly owned by such owner or owners and taken by eminent domain or other involuntary proceeding, except a tax sale, the period of ownership of the former property shall be combined with the period of ownership of the property for which application is made for exemption and such periods of ownership shall be deemed to be consecutive for purposes of this section, Where a residence is sold and replaced with another within one year and both residences are within the state, the period of ownership of both properties shall be deemed consecutive for purposes of the exemption from taxation by a municipality within the state granting such exemption. Where the owner or owners transfer title to property which as of the date of transfer was exempt from taxation under the provisions of this section, the reacquisition of title by such owner or owners within nine months of the date of transfer shall be deemed to satisfy the requirement of this paragraph that the title of the property shall have been vested in the owner or one of the owners for such period of twelve consecutive months. Where, upon or subsequent to the death of an owner or owners, title to property which as of the date of such death was exempt from taxation under such provisions, becomes vested, by virtue of devise or descent from the deceased owner or owners, or by transfer by any other means within nine months after such death, solely in a person or persons who, at the time of such death, maintained such property as a primary residence, the requirement of this paragraph that the title of the property shall have been vested in the owner or one of the owners for such period of twelve consecutive months shall be deemed satisfied:

- (b) the property is used exclusively for residential purposes, provided, however, that in the event any portion of such property is not so used exclusively for residential purposes but is used for other purposes, such portion shall be subject to taxation and the remaining portion only shall be entitled to the exemption provided by this section;
- (c) the real property is the legal residence of and is occupied in whole or in part by the owner or by all of the owners of the property: except where,
 - (1) an owner is absent from the residence while receiving health-related care as an inpatient of a residential health care facility, as defined in section twenty-eight hundred one of the public health law, provided that any income accruing to that person shall only be income only to the extent that it exceeds the amount paid by such owner, spouse, or co-owner for care in the facility, and provided further, that during such confinement such property is not occupied by other than the spouse or co-owner of such owner; or,
 - (2) the real property is owned by a husband and/or wife, or an ex-husband and/or an ex-wife, and either is absent from the residence due to divorce, legal separation or abandonment and all other provisions of this section are met provided that where an exemption was previously granted when both resided on the property,

then the person remaining on the real property shall be sixty-two years of age or over.

(d) the real property otherwise meets the qualifications contained in Real Property Tax Law§ 467, as the same may be amended from time to time.

Section 5. Administration.

Application for such exemption must be made by the owner, or all of the owners of the property upon such forms as may be prescribed from time to time by the NYS Office of Real Property Services. Such applications must be filed with the assessor of the town or city in which the real property is located on or before the taxable status date. Nothing herein shall impair a partial exemption presently enjoyed by an eligible property owner.

Section 6. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

Subject:

Proposal to pass local law relating to income limits for Disability Exemptions

Background:

Currently, Oswego County offers eligible low-income disabled homeowners a 50% exemption on their County Real Property taxes. This exemption is authorized under section 459-C of Real Property Tax Law. Oswego County originally granted this exemption in 2003 using the same income scale as the then current exemption for low-income seniors. There are currently 138 households benefitting from the disability with limited

income exemption.

Proposal:

Real Property Tax Law allows the County to set the maximum income ceiling as high as \$29,000. If the income ceiling were to be increased to this maximum the sliding scale would update to allow for an income up to \$37,400 and all current disabled households benefitting from this exemption would begin receiving the maximum benefit and more would become eligible.

This exemption was previously adopted under Local Law 3 of 2001 and used the same sliding scale as the Senior Exemption. A proposal to increase the income limits for the senior exemption is being present concurrently this this proposal and were it to pass this exemption should also be increased to follow the same sliding scale. As with other local laws a public hearing would need to be held before the local law is adopted.

Local Law:

To accomplish the increase in income limits for this exemption a local law would need to pass to supersede Local Law 3 of 2001 to update the sliding scale for the Disability exemption to be the same as the Senior Exemption as found below:

Statement of Need:

For the purposes of this exemption "income" is inclusive of all income the household makes in the year with very few exclusions. Retirement pensions and social security fully count as income. Income limits for this exemption was based on income limits last adopted by Oswego County in 1999. If you adjust the original sliding scale maximum of \$24,425 for inflation it would be \$44,680 today.

Fiscal Impact:

Value of Exemption

The value of the Disability exemption on the 2021 Assessment Rolls was \$3,977,275 which represents 0.04% of the County's total assessed value. If the higher limit were in place the total value for those same households would have been \$5,161,379 which represents 0.06% of the County's total assessed value.

Effect on Tax Rate

The 2022 generic tax rate was \$6.95 per thousand of assessed value. If the higher income ceiling were in effect the 2022 generic tax rate would have been the same.

- B Allows for exemption to apply for school purposes even if a school-age child attends public school and lives in the household (otherwise exemption is disallowed if a school-age child lives with the senior).
- C Allows exemption for owner-occupied cooperative apartments.

Income Ceiling

The maximum income ceiling (M) to receive full benefit (50%) is \$3,000. Each taxing jurisdiction may choose a higher income ceiling between \$3,000 and \$29,000. This income ceiling was last updated by the NYS legislature in 2009.

COUNTY OF OSWEGO LOCAL LAW NUMBER ____ of 2022 GRANTING A PARTIAL TAX EXEMPTION FOR QUALIFYING PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES UNDER REAL PROPERTY TAX LAW §459-C

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF OSWEGO AS FOLLOWS:

1. Purpose and Intent.

The County Legislature has, heretofore, adopted Local Law Number 3 of 2001 to provide a partial tax exemption for qualifying persons with disabilities in accordance with Real Property Tax Law §459-C. The intent of this local law is to SUPERCEDE Local Law Number 3 of 2001 and to raise the maximum income levels to reflect changes in income, cost of living increases and expenses since 2001 and to have the partial exemption granted hereunder mirror the partial tax exemption allowed by the County of Oswego under Real Property Tax Law §467 for qualifying persons 65 and older. This local law increases the income sliding scale for the partial exemption to be granted hereunder consistent with Real Property Tax Law §459-C.

2. Application and Partial Exemption Granted; Local Law 3 of 2001 Superceded

The provisions of Local Law Number 3 of 2001 be and are hereby SUPERCEDED in its entirety by this local law. The provisions of Real Property Tax Law Section 459-C relative to partial tax exemption to persons with disabilities who have limited incomes, shall apply to County Real Property Taxes levied by the County of Oswego.

3. Qualifying Income for the Partial Exemption under RPTL 459-C.

This local law hereby grants a partial exemption under RPTL §459-C, per the following sliding scale:

Jefferson County/Oswego County Microwave upgrade 2/16/22

At the February Legislature meeting, the Legislature approved a memorandum of agreement between Jefferson and Oswego County for the purchase of a microwave link between Oswego County's Sandy Creek tower site and Oswego County's Mexico tower site. The proposal for this project is \$185,000. The MOA stated that Oswego County would purchase the equipment and that Jefferson County would reimburse Oswego County using grant funds. In order to proceed with this, the E911 budget needs to be increased to cover the additional amount.

Contract Amendment to the Oswego County Contract for the Provision of Public Transit Services

PURPOSE:

To authorize Oswego County to reimburse OCO, public transportation provider at a higher rate to address the increase in the cost of fuel and to address the cost of increase to bus driver salaries in order to be competitive and to attract new drivers and retain existing drivers.

SUMMARY:

A Resolution authorizing the Chairman to enter into a contract for the provision of public transit services was approved on June 10, 2021. The RFP was named #21-CD-003 Public Transportation Services was dated March 18, 2021, and responses were due April 30, 2021. OCO was the only was the sole responder to this RFP.

OCO received the contract and between March 2021 and September 2021, when the contract was presented to OCO for signing; it was noted that fuel prices were on the rise and there was a need to pay bus drivers a more competitive wage. The current wage represented in the contract is \$18.00 an hour. The competitive pay rate is \$21.00 an hour. This is the rate of pay for a entry level CENTRO bus driver. The cost of fuel in the RFP response and contract is \$2.21/gallon. The current fuel rate is \$2.92/gallon is the current cost.

A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING THE PROVISION OF MASS TRANSPORTATION AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF MASS TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES WITHIN THE COUNTY OF OSWEGO

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF OSWEGO AS FOLLOWS:

Article 1. Title

This Local Law shall be known as "A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING THE PROVISION OF MASS TRANSPORTATION AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF MASS TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES WITHIN THE COUNTY OF OSWEGO."

Article 2. Statutory Authority

This Local Law is enacted pursuant to the express authority provided to the County of Oswego under General Municipal Law §119-r and its general home rule powers under Municipal Home Rule Law §10(1)(I).

Article 3. Definitions

As used in this Local Law, the following terms as defined by GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW §119-q, shall mean and include as follows:

- a. "Municipal corporation" shall mean a town, village, county not wholly contained within a city, special transportation district, public benefit corporation or other public corporation, or two or more of the foregoing acting jointly.
- b. "Mass transportation capital project" shall mean the acquisition, construction, reconstruction or improvement of any rapid transit, railroad, railroad freight capital facility, omnibus, marine transportation or other mass transportation capital facility and any capital equipment used in connection therewith.
- c. "Airport or aviation capital project" shall mean the acquisition, construction, reconstruction or improvement of an airport or aviation capital facility and any capital equipment used in connection therewith.
- d. "Federal mass transportation operating assistance" shall mean any federal financial assistance granted for the specific purpose of paying the operating expenses of any public transportation system, as such term is defined in section eighteen-a of the Transportation Law, or any rail freight system, in providing transportation services.

Article 4. Purpose and Intent

The purpose and intent of this Local Law is to allow the County of Oswego, as a municipal corporation, to provide mass transportation services to the public within the County of Oswego, to authorize and establish a mass transportation system within the County of Oswego, to enter into contracts as provided for by law regarding mass transportation services and to do any other activities authorized under General Municipal Law §119-r, as amended, effective April 1, 2022 (L.2016, c. 54, pt. PP, § 3.) The County Legislature of the County of Oswego hereby finds and determines there is a need for the provision of mass transportation services within the County of Oswego and by enacting this local law the county intends to provide and/or contract for same.

Article 5. Legislative Powers Invoked as to Mass Transportation Services and Facilities

Upon the adoption of this Local Law, to assure the provision of mass transportation services to, and mass transportation facilities for, the public within the County of Oswego at adequate levels and at reasonable cost, the following powers are hereby conferred upon and authorized by the County of Oswego, a municipal corporation by and of the State of New York:

- 1. a. The acquisition, construction, reconstruction, improvement, equipment, maintenance or operation of one or more mass transportation projects. The County of Oswego shall have power to occupy or use any of the streets, roads, highways, avenues, parks or public places of such municipal corporation therefor and to agree upon and contract for the terms and conditions thereof.
 - b. The making of a contract or contracts for the acquisition by purchase of all or any part of the property, plant and equipment of an existing mass transportation facility actually used and useful for the convenience of the public.
 - c. The making of a contract or contracts with any person, firm or corporation, including a public authority, for the equipment, maintenance or operation of a mass transportation facility owned, acquired, constructed, reconstructed or improved by it.
 - d. The making of a contract or contracts for a fair and reasonable consideration for mass transportation services to be rendered to the public by a privately-owned or operated mass transportation facility. Such power shall include, but not be limited to, the power to appropriate funds for payment of such consideration, and to provide that all or part of such consideration shall be in the form of capital equipment to be furnished to and used and maintained by such privately-owned or operated mass transportation facility.
 - e. The making of unconditional grants of money or property to a public authority providing mass transportation services to all or part of such municipal corporation in order to assist such public authority in meeting its capital or operating expenses, provided such money does not consist of borrowed funds and such property has not been acquired by the use of borrowed funds. Such purpose is hereby declared to be county, city, town or village purposes, respectively. The provisions of this paragraph are intended as enabling legislation only and shall not be interpreted as implying that absent their enactment a

municipal corporation would lack the power to authorize any such grant; but they shall not be interpreted as an authorization to public authorities generally to accept such grants. The acceptance of any such grant by a public authority shall not operate to make such authority an agency of the municipal corporation making the grant.

- 2. The acquisition, construction, reconstruction, or improvement of any mass transportation capital project by a county, city, town or village pursuant to this section shall not be subject to the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Transportation except as provided in sections sixty-eight, sixty-nine, sixty-nine-a, sixty-nine-b, sixty-nine-c, and sixty-nine-d of the Transportation Corporations Law.
- 3. The powers granted by this Local Law shall be in addition to and not in substitution for any other power to acquire, construct, reconstruct, improve, equip, maintain or operate any mass transportation capital project.
- 4. The powers conferred by this Local Law shall also expressly include the powers of the County of Oswego to act under GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW §119-s, entitled "Participation in federal and state assistance programs for mass transportation and airport and aviation projects" regarding the power of the County of Oswego, either individually or jointly with one or more other municipal corporations, to apply for, accept, and expend financial assistance for one or more mass transportation capital projects or for one or more airport or aviation capital projects and as otherwise provided for in said statute.

Article 6. Applicability

This Local Law shall apply to all actions occurring on or after the effective date of this local law.

Article 7. Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity or circumstance shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law, or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such order or judgment shall be rendered.

Article 8. SEQRA Determination

The County Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this law constitutes a Type II action pursuant to

Section 617.5(c)(33) of Title 6 of the New York Code of Rules and Regulations (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK STATE ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection. The Clerk of the Legislature is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance as may be necessary in accordance with this Local Law.

Article 9. Effective Date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the Office of the Secretary of State.

It is mandated that this employee be a certified or licensed professional who will assist and participate in the decisions which determine services for preschoolers with special educational needs. The Health Department is reassigning all nursing positions to one of the nursing divisions, therefore, we will need to have fill this position with someone who is certified or

license in something other than nursing.

RECOMMENDED

Justification for Reclassification of RN to Educational Specialist:

Over the years, it became apparent that it would be best consolidate all RN positions to one of the divisions in nursing, thus the need for a reclassification. The work involves responsibility to act as the Oswego County representative to the Committee for Preschool Education (CPSE) as mandated per Section 4410 of the New York State Education Law. It is mandated that this employee be a certified or licensed professional who will assist and participate in the decisions which determine services for preschoolers with special educational needs. This position works with all 9 school districts in Oswego County and is an important part of the Preschool Special Education team. They make sure decisions are made that are appropriate for the child, while at the same time, being fiscally responsible with Oswego County tax dollars. This position supports a 6.5-million-dollar program. The employee in this class is given considerable latitude for independent action and initiative in areas of identifying educational specialties and interpreting regulations and program policy.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SETTLEMENT OF THE MATTER OF TOWN OF MEXICO VS. COUNTY OF OSWEGO ON CERTAIN TERMS

By Legislator Stephen Walpole:

WHEREAS, the County of Oswego was sued by the Town of Mexico in 2017 for non-payment of snow and ice bills from December of 2016 totaling \$26,001.19; and

WHEREAS, the county had denied payment as the bills were late under the terms of the agreement between the parties

WHEREAS, the case was dismissed by Supreme Court, Oswego County on documentary evidence and subsequently appealed to the Appellate Division, Fourth Department by the town; and

WHEREAS, the Appellate Division, Fourth Department found that there was a valid condition precedent to payment in the county's contract (e.g. timely submitting bills within 30 days) but there was also a question as to whether the county waived same; and

WHEREAS, the litigation was discontinued (C-2018-0104) during discovery as it was discovered the town board had not authorized same by board resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Mexico sued the County of Oswego again in 2020 (C-2020-0740) and after delays due to the COVID pandemic the parties have participated in a preliminary conference with a Supreme Court Justice; this case is still pending and the parties are presently engaged in discovery; and

WHEREAS, the parties now wish to amicably resolve this litigation without an admission of wrongdoing by either party on certain terms; and

WHEREAS, after careful consideration, settlement of this litigation promotes intermunicipal cooperation, governmental efficiency and removes the uncertainty of a Court decision for both the town and the county,

NOW, THEREFORE, upon recommendation of the Infrastructure and Facilities Committee, it is hereby

RESOLVED, that the County of Oswego accepts the demand of the Town of Mexico to settle this litigation and hereby authorizes the payment of the sum of \$13,000 to resolve this litigation said payment to be held in escrow pending the exchange of mutual releases and a stipulation of discontinuance; and, it is further
