

**SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PERMIT CONDITIONS**

1. **Conformance With Plans** All activities authorized by this permit must be in strict conformance with the permit application, plans and materials prepared by Oswego County on various dates, see Condition 3A.

2. **General Requirements**

A. This permit may be modified, revoked or suspended for cause as specified in 6NYCRR 621.13. The filing of a request for a permit modification, revocation and reissuance, or suspension, or the notification of planned changes or anticipated noncompliance on the part of Oswego County does not stay the applicability or enforceability of any permit condition.

B. The provisions of this permit are severable, and if any provision of this permit, or the application of any provision of this permit to any circumstance is held invalid by the Department, the application of such provision to other circumstances and the remainder of this permit may not be affected thereby.

C. Oswego County shall comply with all conditions of this permit and 6NYCRR Part 360. Noncompliance constitutes a violation of ECL Article 27, Title 7 and is grounds for enforcement action, permit suspension, revocation, modification, or denial of a permit renewal application.

D. Oswego County shall take all steps to minimize or correct any adverse impact on human health or the environment resulting from facility operations. Oswego County shall report any such activity which may endanger human health or the environment to the Department as per Condition 2E.

E. Oswego County shall allow any authorized representative of the Department and/or the Oswego County Health Department, upon the presentation of proper credentials to:

- i. Have access to and copy, at reasonable times, any records that must be kept under the conditions of this permit, including any and all confidential data included in such records; and
- ii. Enter and inspect at reasonable times any facilities, equipment (including monitoring and control equipment), practices, or operations regulated or required under this permit; and
- iii. Sample or monitor, at reasonable times, for the purpose of assuring permit compliance or as otherwise authorized by the ECL, any substances or parameters at any location.

F. Unless otherwise specified (see General Condition #3), all submissions required by this permit



shall be made to the Region 7 Headquarters (615 Erie Blvd. West, Syracuse, NY 13204-2400, Attn: Regional Materials Management Engineer) and the Bureau of Permitting and Planning, Division of Materials Management (NYSDEC, 625 Broadway, Albany, NY 12233). All approvals required by this permit shall be obtained in writing from the Regional Director of Region 7 or his designated representative.

G. The following wastes shall not be disposed of at the site under this permit:

- i. Hazardous waste as defined in Part 371;
- ii. Waste identified in 6NYCRR 360-2.17(m);
- iii. Industrial wastes which are incompatible with municipal waste, as determined by the Department;
- iv. Any drum or container which has held hazardous waste and is not empty according to 40 CFR 261.7(a)(3)(1);
- v. Any industrial and commercial liquids, sludges or slurries which are less than 20 percent solids and are described in this condition;
- vi. Any waste(s) regulated by 6NYCRR Part 364 unless the waste hauler possesses a valid Part 364 permit which specifies this landfill as a disposal site for such waste(s) and disposal of such waste has been approved by this Department.
- vii. Regulated medical waste as defined by 360-17.2(h);

H. Oswego County shall request written authorization from the Department prior to the acceptance for disposal of any sludges, septage, slurries, chemical waste, utility or industrial power plant waste, or industrial wastes.

I. An annual report must be submitted on a form provided by or acceptable to the Department and no later than 60 days after the first day of January of each year of operation to the persons listed in Condition 2F. The annual report must include but is not limited to:

- i. The total quantity in tons of solid waste disposed of from January 1st to December 31st. This information must be compiled by each waste type, such as Mixed Municipal Solid Waste (MSW), Construction & Demolition Debris, Asbestos, Industrial Waste, Ash from MSW Energy Recovery, Petroleum Contaminated Soil, and totaled in average tons per day and tons per quarter.
- ii. The remaining site life and capacity in cubic yards and tons of the existing constructed landfill. The remaining capacity and site life of other areas not yet built, but which have received entitlement under this permit. The remaining site life and capacity will be estimated from survey information obtained during the year for which the report is prepared.
- iii. The estimate of the actual in situ waste density shall be made considering the accumulation volume of landfill air space utilized and the amount of waste disposed of.
- iv. A compilation of all water and leachate quality data collected throughout the year as required by 6NYCRR Part 360.
- v. The treatment facility must be identified as well as the total amount of leachate collected and transported off-site on a monthly basis.
- vi. The amount of leachate collected in the secondary collection and removal system must be compiled on a monthly basis.
- vii. Any changes from the approved report, plans and specifications or permit conditions must be listed with justification for any change given, including any deviation from the approved fill



progression plan.

viii. The tipping fee charged by waste type in dollars per ton and the cost of leachate transportation and treatment.

ix. The amount in tons per year of each solid waste type recovered from disposal and its final destination.

x. A yearly accounting of the status of the closure and post-closure fund shall be included in the Annual Report for the facility and the closure and post-closure cost estimate shall be reviewed and adjusted as necessary. The effective date for subpart 360-2.19, Financial Assurance Criteria, shall be April 9, 1997 unless regulatory changes amend this date.

J. This permit shall not relieve Oswego County from complying in all respects with the terms of any Federal, State, or applicable local law or regulation, including, but not limited to, the obtaining of any other required permit or form of approval.

K. Oswego County shall provide financial assurance for closure and post-closure operations, environmental monitoring and maintenance as required by 6 NYCRR Part 360-2.19, effective October 9, 1993, including all revisions that apply.

L. Oswego County shall notify the Department of any planned physical alterations or additions to the facility that affect permit compliance before they are implemented. Notification of the Department shall be in writing and in accordance with Permit Condition 2F.

M. This permit is for the disposal of 100,000 tons per year of solid waste.

N. At least 180 days before the last receipt of waste, Oswego County must submit to the Department, for its approval, a Closure Site Investigation Report meeting the requirements of Part 360-2.15(a).

O. At least 60 days before the last receipt of waste, Oswego County must submit to the Department, for its approval, a Closure Plan meeting the requirements of Part 360.2.15(c).

### 3. Facility Construction

A. The facility shall be constructed in strict conformance with the provisions of this permit, 6NYCRR Part 360, revised effective May 12, 2006, the following approved engineering plans and reports as prepared by Barton and Loguidice Engineers, P.C., and all Department approved revisions to these plans and reports:

i. All original permit documentation and drawings which formed the basis for the original permit. These included the Manual of Operation (1980), Appendices to the Manual of Operation and Draft Environmental Impact Statement (1980), Draft Environmental Impact Statement (1980), and Volney Sanitary Landfill Operating Plan Drawings (1980).

- B. Any expansion (beyond station 024 on sheet #1 of #7) of the April 1989 drawings will require the submission of new plans and specifications in accordance with the current Part 360 requirements in



effect at that time.

- C. Notice of the commencement of all major portions of on-site construction activities must be made to the Department at least 5 business days in advance of the activity. These activities include but are not limited to the commencement of the clearing and grading, commencement of the placement of the liner, all quality control and quality assurance testing including on-site permeability and/or density testing activities, and the commencement of construction of any section of permanent final cover.
- D. Prior to deposition of refuse, Oswego County shall (i) demonstrate to the Department's satisfaction that the facility's construction is in accordance with this Permit to Construct (and plans approved thereunder) and (ii) submit certification of construction in accordance with 6NYCRR Part 360-1.11 and 360-2.13(u) within 45 days after completion of landfill construction. This certification report must contain at a minimum, as-built drawings noting any deviation from the approved comprehensive narrative including but not limited to weekly summaries from the project engineer's log and a series of color photographs of major project features. Copies of the engineer's daily report will be kept on the site for the life of the permit. The report must also include daily flow measurement from the secondary leachate collection and removal system for a period of not less than 30 consecutive days prior to deposition of waste.

#### 4. Operations

- A. Oswego County shall submit for Department review and approval an updated Operations Plan meeting the requirements of Part 360-2.9 within 120 days of the effective date of the permit. All landfill personnel who are involved with the daily operations of the landfill shall be made aware of the following operational conditions, the operational requirements found in 360-1.14 and 360-2.17, and the Operation Plan of the facility.
- B. Solid waste shall only be accepted between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday. The landfill shall not be operated on Sundays, major holidays and beyond the above hours except in the event of emergencies or unusual circumstances.
- C. Adequate access roads shall be maintained at all times to allow refuse hauling vehicles to reach the active working face. No penetrating or waste oils shall be used for dust control.
- D. Wind blown paper and other litter shall be confined to within 200 feet of the waste disposal area by snow fence, portable screens, natural screening or any other necessary devices. Oswego County shall police wind blown paper and litter wastes along with landfill's perimeter at a frequency of no less than once a month.
- E. Solid waste must not be accepted at this facility unless the waste is adequately covered or confined in the vehicle transporting the waste to prevent dust and blowing litter.
- F. Prior to and during any soil excavation and stockpiling activities on site, Oswego County shall implement adequate measures to prevent siltation of surface water including drainage ditches, streams, ponds and wetlands through and adjacent to the site. Straw and other types of erosion dams should be



routinely used as needed on the site.

G. Solid waste shall be spread in two foot layers or less and compacted upon deposition at the working face by appropriately sized compaction equipment making a minimum of three passes. The working face shall be restricted to the smallest area practical, based on peak usage traffic conditions at the landfill. Facility staff will routinely observe the solid waste lift during compaction and covering activities for presence of unpermitted waste. Any such waste detected shall be removed from the working face and brought to the attention of the site foreman.

H. During the placement of the first lift of waste above the primary leachate collection and removal system, the following precautions and practices will be observed in order that penetration of the liner is prevented:

i. Consideration for the approach and travel of haul trucks and other landfill operation vehicles relative to the location of the liner and leachate collection laterals.

ii. Waste placement must be kept away from the top of the berms to allow for proper leachate control and effective future placement of final cover. Identification marker may be used along the berms with specific setback distances for waste placement.

iii. Placement of a select type of waste being free of unprocessed demolition debris, large metal wastes, long items such as poles, piping and bulky wastes in general and such refuse shall be placed in a minimum compacted lift thickness of at least 5 feet above the leachate collection and removal system.

I. A compacted layer of at least six inches of soil cover material, or other such alternative daily cover material as proposed by Oswego County and approved by the Department shall be placed on all exposed solid waste at the end of each day of operation.

J. If refuse is deposited within a cell located on top of an area which has received intermediate or final cover, a portion of the soil cover shall be removed from the area to be filled so as to adequately allow leachate to reach the leachate collection system.

K. Cover soil and drainage control structures shall be designed, graded, and maintained to prevent ponding and erosion and to reduce to a minimum infiltration of water into the solid waste cells.

L. Inspection, operation and maintenance, and monitoring systems schedules shall be conducted per the following schedule:

An annual notation with regard to water quality sampling and analysis in the Activity Frequency Column indicates that baseline parameters must be sampled for at an annual frequency; however, sampling for baseline parameters should be rotated during the quarterly sampling events.

(2) Reporting Frequency Column indicates frequency of reporting.

M. Oswego County shall select a waste collection vehicle at random at least once weekly and unload its solid waste at the working face for inspection for unauthorized wastes. A record of this inspection must be kept on the premises and be available for Department review to ensure only authorized solid waste is being accepted at the facility.

N. Radio communications between the landfill office and the working face shall be provided at all times during operating hours.

O. All structures, including the leachate collection and removal system, groundwater and gas



monitoring wells, access roads, drainage structures, recharge basins, etc., shall be maintained in the proper working order. In the event any structure becomes damaged or malfunctions in any way, Oswego County shall immediately notify the Department in writing, as per Condition 2F and shall immediately repair or replace the structure to the Department's satisfaction.

P. All monitoring wells (groundwater and gas) shall be fitted with locking caps and be locked at all times other than during times of sampling.

#### 5. Leachate Collection, Storage and Disposal

A. As used herein, the term "leachate" shall include:

- i. any liquid which accumulates in the leachate collection system;
- ii. any solid waste in the form of liquid, including any suspended components in the liquid, which results from contact with or passage through solid waste;
- iii. any liquid in the retention basins, or the secondary containment area, or any other constructed liquid discharge points of the leachate storage facility which exceeds one or more of the discharge limits specified in Condition 5B.

B. Any leachate present on the ground surface outside the lined landfill and leachate collection and storage system shall immediately be transferred to the leachate collection and storage system or transported to an authorized disposal site.

C. Under no circumstances shall leachate be discharged directly or indirectly from the site to surface waters, except pursuant to a SPDES permit.

D. Oswego County, on a daily basis, shall measure the amount of leachate collected in the secondary leachate collection system and calculate the 30 day rolling average leakage rate for the primary liner. Should the 30 day rolling average leakage rate exceed 20 gallons per acre per day, Oswego County shall notify the Department within seven (7) days in writing and immediately initiate the appropriate actions as defined in the contingency plan. A standard report form shall be initiated by the landfill operator indicating the time, date and result of these field inspections including the results of any tests which might be performed to determine the nature of detected fluids (i.e specific conductivity, pH, temperature). These reports shall be submitted to the Department as part of the Annual Report.

E. The primary leachate and collection and removal system shall be flushed at least annually to maintain an unobstructed and free draining collection system. Should the efficiency of the leachate collection and removal be found to be impaired, remedial cleaning operations shall be conducted with notification of such activity given to the Department.

F. Oswego County shall submit a revised and updated Contingency Plan to the Department for its review and approval within 120 days of the issuance of this permit. The updated Contingency Plan shall meet the requirements of PArt 360-2.10(b) and specifically address the following:

- i. what to do in the event of a leachate spill;



ii. the alternative leachate disposal/treatment methods that will be available in the event that the Primary Waste Water Treatment Plant will not accept Oswego County's leachate at its wastewater treatment plant. An arrangement for a backup leachate disposal/treatment facility must be maintained on an annual basis by Oswego County or its agent.

G. Leachate removed from the facility shall be by a hauler in possession of a valid Part 364 permit, authorizing them to haul leachate from the facility to a specified disposal site approved by the Department.

## 6. Recycling

A. Oswego County shall not accept at the facility any solid waste which was generated within a municipality that has either not completed a Comprehensive Recycling Analysis (CRA) or is not included in another municipality's CRA satisfying the requirements of 6NYCRR Part 360-1.9(f) which has been approved by the Department and implemented the recyclables recovery program determined to be feasible by the analysis. Oswego County must verify with the Department the status of a municipality's CRA prior to accepting waste from the municipality.

B. Oswego County shall not discontinue the source separation and collection of any or all of the recyclables collected as part of the recyclables recovery program or disposal of same, unless, for the particular recyclable in question, Oswego County has properly determined that there is no economic market (as defined in General Municipal Law 120-aa). The Department may require Oswego County to demonstrate, in writing, how the analysis was performed and conclusions reached before accepting any such discontinuance. Any disposal of recyclables must have Department approval.

C. Oswego County shall submit three copies of a revised and updated CRA to the Department for its review and approval by July 1, 1995 and every three years thereafter. The CRA update shall include any information required through special conditions contained in this permit. It shall also reflect the status of Oswego County's recyclables recovery program on the date of submittal and planned future changes.

D. Oswego County shall provide reasonable access and assistance to representatives of municipalities from which solid waste originates and is delivered to the facility. Access and assistance shall be provided so that these municipalities may develop and implement a program to characterize the solid waste from the municipality and identify additional recoverable recyclables that can be added to these municipalities' source separation programs.

**7. Updated Environmental Monitoring Plan & Updated Site Analytical Plan** The Environmental Monitoring Plan, dated March 1998 – Revised January 2007, shall be updated within 120 days of substantial completion of any new cell construction at the facility or of the date of this permit to include:

- a) A description of changes made at the site including:
  - (i) Construction of the capped portions of the site
  - (ii) Construction of cell 4 and use of side riser pumping system
- b) A schedule for the installation of additional monitoring wells for future cell construction;
- c) Additional facility sampling locations including primary and secondary leachate collection and groundwater collection systems from side riser building;



- d) Sediment sampling schedule.

The Site Analytical Plan, dated January 2007, shall be updated within 90 days of any change in laboratory or of the date of this permit. The requirements of Part 360-2.11(d) shall be met.

## 8. Air Requirements

A. The maximum amount of Solid Waste (as defined in 40 CFR 60 Subpart WWW) that can be placed in the Oswego County Landfill is limited to less than 2.5 million metric tons or 2.5 million cubic meters. The County must submit a copy of the Annual Report required in Condition 2H to the NYSDEC Region 7 Headquarters (Attn. Regional Air Engineer, 615 Erie Blvd. West, Syracuse, NY 13204) within 60 days of the end of each calendar year. The annual report shall report the total amount of solid waste, including all incinerator ash, that has been placed in the entire landfill to date. This includes all active and closed cells, consistent with the definition of design capacity contained in 40 CFR 60 Subpart WWW.

This limit will no longer be in effect upon issuance of a Title V air permit for the landfill that includes provision for compliance with the requirements of 40 CFR Subpart WWW and 6NYCRR Part 208, and any other Air requirements that apply to the facility at that time. Upon issuance of the Title V permit, the maximum design capacity will be determined in accordance with the applicable Air rules and any enforceable limitations contained in any permit issued by the Department.

### GENERAL CONDITIONS - Apply to ALL Authorized Permits:

**1. Facility Inspection by The Department** The permitted site or facility, including relevant records, is subject to inspection at reasonable hours and intervals by an authorized representative of the Department of Environmental Conservation (the Department) to determine whether the permittee is complying with this permit and the ECL. Such representative may order the work suspended pursuant to ECL 71- 0301 and SAPA 401(3).

The permittee shall provide a person to accompany the Department's representative during an inspection to the permit area when requested by the Department.

A copy of this permit, including all referenced maps, drawings and special conditions, must be available for inspection by the Department at all times at the project site or facility. Failure to produce a copy of the permit upon request by a Department representative is a violation of this permit.

**2. Relationship of this Permit to Other Department Orders and Determinations** Unless expressly provided for by the Department, issuance of this permit does not modify, supersede or rescind any order or determination previously issued by the Department or any of the terms, conditions or requirements contained in such order or determination.

**3. Applications For Permit Renewals, Modifications or Transfers** The permittee must submit a separate written application to the Department for permit renewal, modification or transfer of this



permit. Such application must include any forms or supplemental information the Department requires. Any renewal, modification or transfer granted by the Department must be in writing. Submission of applications for permit renewal, modification or transfer are to be submitted to:

**4. Submission of Renewal Application** The permittee must submit a renewal application at least 180 days before permit expiration for the following permit authorizations: Solid Waste Management.

**5. Permit Modifications, Suspensions and Revocations by the Department** The Department reserves the right to exercise all available authority to modify, suspend or revoke this permit. The grounds for modification, suspension or revocation include:

- a. materially false or inaccurate statements in the permit application or supporting papers;
- b. failure by the permittee to comply with any terms or conditions of the permit;
- c. exceeding the scope of the project as described in the permit application;
- d. newly discovered material information or a material change in environmental conditions, relevant technology or applicable law or regulations since the issuance of the existing permit;
- e. noncompliance with previously issued permit conditions, orders of the commissioner, any provisions of the Environmental Conservation Law or regulations of the Department related to the permitted activity.

**6. Permit Transfer** Permits are transferrable unless specifically prohibited by statute, regulation or another permit condition. Applications for permit transfer should be submitted prior to actual transfer of ownership.

## NOTIFICATION OF OTHER PERMITTEE OBLIGATIONS

### **Item A: Permittee Accepts Legal Responsibility and Agrees to Indemnification**

The permittee, excepting state or federal agencies, expressly agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Department of Environmental Conservation of the State of New York, its representatives, employees, and agents ("DEC") for all claims, suits, actions, and damages, to the extent attributable to the permittee's acts or omissions in connection with the permittee's undertaking of activities in connection with, or operation and maintenance of, the facility or facilities authorized by the permit whether in compliance or not in compliance with the terms and conditions of the permit. This indemnification does not extend to any claims, suits, actions, or damages to the extent attributable to DEC's own negligent or intentional acts or omissions, or to any claims, suits, or actions naming the DEC and arising under Article 78 of the New York Civil Practice Laws and Rules or any citizen suit or civil rights provision under federal or state laws.



**Item B: Permittee's Contractors to Comply with Permit**

The permittee is responsible for informing its independent contractors, employees, agents and assigns of their responsibility to comply with this permit, including all special conditions while acting as the permittee's agent with respect to the permitted activities, and such persons shall be subject to the same sanctions for violations of the Environmental Conservation Law as those prescribed for the permittee.

**Item C: Permittee Responsible for Obtaining Other Required Permits**

The permittee is responsible for obtaining any other permits, approvals, lands, easements and rights-of-way that may be required to carry out the activities that are authorized by this permit.

**Item D: No Right to Trespass or Interfere with Riparian Rights**

This permit does not convey to the permittee any right to trespass upon the lands or interfere with the riparian rights of others in order to perform the permitted work nor does it authorize the impairment of any rights, title, or interest in real or personal property held or vested in a person not a party to the permit.
