

Public Works Committee Meeting

Minutes

January 4th, 2017

Attendance – Robert Williams – MSG, Andy Langenderfer Tetra Tech, Laurie Adams - DGL, Ms. Zuchowski-Eckel, Mr. Ruse, Mr. Kolb, Mrs. Freeman and Mr. Scott,

- Tetra Tech came in to discuss the State Route 65 Paving Project, phases 1 and 2. The project has been combined from two phases into one project for construction in 2018. The schedule should not be an issue. They are finishing up the Topo and the right of way and we should be able to meet in the next few weeks to go over the down town areas that require new curbing.
- Laurie Adams from DGL came to update the committee on the Safe Route to Schools Project. This phase of the project concentrates on the Glenwood Road/Wales Road area and includes sidewalks and cross walks that will connect Arbor Hills to Glenwood and ultimately the Junior High with sidewalks the whole way. The project includes finishing the sidewalks along East Elm Tree as well. Plans need to be to the Central office by the end of January. There is a mid March Bid Date and construction will be done over the summer. This is the last piece of the Safe Route to Schools project and will be 100% reimbursed.
- Mr. Langenderfer updated the Committee on the Lime City/SR 65/Colony Road intersection project. Tetra Tech, Mr. Scott and MSG will be putting together a spreadsheet with the past projected costs and the 2017 costs. They will include right of way acquisition projections as well. TMACOG is asking for a design decision on this project by mid-February. The committee would like to have a special council meeting on January 16th to discuss this intersection and the bike path as well as the funding comparisons.
- Everything has been signed and agreed upon by all parties so that the Buck Road/Lime City Road Round-a-bout project can proceed into the Right of Way acquisition phase.
- The committee approved Mr. Kolb's request to surplus two lawn mowers.
- The committee also approved Mr. Kolb's request to purchase a new bobcat. The current one is a '99. The state bid cost is \$37,894.50. This purchase was planned and is in the budget.
