

Ordinances Affecting Retailers

Zoning Regulations (Ord. 1540, passed March 11, 2019)

- Firearm Establishment Business Area
- Minimum of 1000 feet from:
 - Residential zoning districts
 - A school, day care center, youth center, community center, place of worship, or park
 - Another retail establishment selling ammunition or firearms



Firearm Establishment Business Area

Law Enforcement Permit (Ord. 1541, passed March 11, 2019)

- Sheriff's Office must issue Law Enforcement Permit prior to application for a conditional use permit
- Regulates employee background checks and business operations

Ordinance Affecting the Public

Safe Storage (Ord. 1542, passed March 11, 2019)

- Firearms within any residence must be stored in a locked container or disabled with a trigger lock unless:
 - The individual is carrying the firearm, or it is within their immediate control, in accordance with applicable laws, or
 - The firearm is under the control of a peace officer

Public Gatherings (Ord. 1542, passed March 11, 2019)

- Firearms are prohibited at public gatherings unless:
 - The person is a peace officer, member of the armed forces, guard of a financial institution, etc.

Gun Violence Restraining Order (GVRO)

What is a GVRO?

- Civil Procedure to temporarily remove guns, ammunition, and magazines from individuals who pose a significant risk of harm to themselves or others
- Restricts restrained individuals from purchasing new guns, ammunition, and magazines

Who can petition for a GVRO?

 Family members, household members, employers, certain teachers/school employees and law enforcement



County Gun Buyback Program

Purpose

- To collect unwanted, unused, and unsecured guns, no questions asked
- \$100 to \$200 cash

Impact

- Since 2018, Sheriff's Office has collected over 2,000 firearms at buyback events
- Will host two events per year through 2023


City of San Carlos' Contributions

- \$50,000 donation on March 12, 2018 (Res. 2018-034)
- \$75,000 (\$30,000 donation and \$45,000 matching) on March 9, 2020
