### PROJECT OVERVIEW

*Over the past decade*, Stockton has experienced significant changes in the City's land use and transportation planning context, as the effects of the Great Recession combined with new policy and regulatory goals have prompted the City to reimagine its vision for transportation and land use development in the 21st Century. The City has undertaken several significant planning efforts to implement this vision, including completing its first Climate Action Plan, initiating a comprehensive amendment to its General Plan, and helping to develop the region's Regional Transportation Plan / Sustainable Communities Strategy. The City now strives to rewrite its Bicycle Master Plan to support local and regional goals for sustainable mobility and growth and to ensure that the next phase of bicycle infrastructure and complementary efforts implemented by the City are both feasible and fundable.

- WHERE** is existing bicycle activity occurring?
- WHERE** do gaps in the existing network create barriers to biking in Stockton?
- HOW** can the city better serve children and seniors bicycling?
- WHAT** facilities or programs would best meet the communities' needs and support the largest "mode shift" to bicycling?
- HOW** can the City fund and prioritize improvements to get the most "bang for our buck"?
