

**MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE REGULAR SESSION OF THE
TOWN COUNCIL
OF THE TOWN OF SMYRNA
ON MAY 16, 2017**

The Town Council of the Town of Smyrna, Rutherford County, Tennessee, met in regular session at 5:00 p.m. on May 16, 2017 at Town Hall with the Honorable Mary Esther Reed, Mayor, presiding.

Mayor Reed called the meeting to order. The invocation was offered Police Chief Kevin Arnold. The pledge of allegiance was led by Fire Chief Bill Culbertson.

1. Approval or Correction of Minutes of the April 10-11, April 11 and April 27, 2017 meetings.

The Town Council first considered a motion by Council Member Tim Morrell to approve the minutes of the April 10-11, 2017 Town Council Retreat, April 11, 2017 regular session of the Town Council and the April 27, 2017 regular work session of the Town Council. The motion was duly seconded by Council Member Steve Sullivan. Following discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.

2. Correspondence/Communications.

Town Manager Harry Gill reported there will be an announcement by Mayor Mary Esther Reed on Thursday, May 18th at 2:00 p.m. at the Smyrna Event Center regarding the Captain Jeff Kuss USMC Memorial. He also stated the Town has been proactive to remedy drainage problems.

Following discussion, Mayor Mary Esther Reed suspended the rule to allow David Alcorn of Southern Lifestyle Homes and Tim McClure, owner and developer, to address the Town Council. The motion was duly seconded by Council Member H. G. Cole. Following further discussion, the motion was approved unanimously. 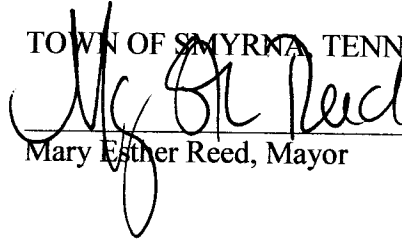
Fire Chief Bill Culbertson spoke about Kid's Safety Day on May 20th at the Event Center.
