## BICYCLE ADVISORY COMMISSION



**APRIL:** BAC and Staff joined MAG, WFRC, Bike Utah, and other local municipalities on a biking tour of Davis, California. Davis is one of the few communities with a Platinum level Bicycle Friendly Community designation in the Country. Vineyard City is currently a Bronze designation. BAC, in collaboration with residents and staff, is working towards implementing lessons learned from Davis to improve upon the biking network and safety of riders in Vineyard. The BAC is also working towards a higher Bicycle Friendly Community designation from the League of American Bicyclists.

**MAY:** BAC worked with city staff to organize Bike Month. Bike Month included various activities such as scavenger hunts, a bike tour of Vineyard City, a bike safety rodeo for kids, and a bike parade as part of Vineyard Days.

BAC started safety studies and surveys in 2023 that will inform 2024 proposals for trail improvements and connections.

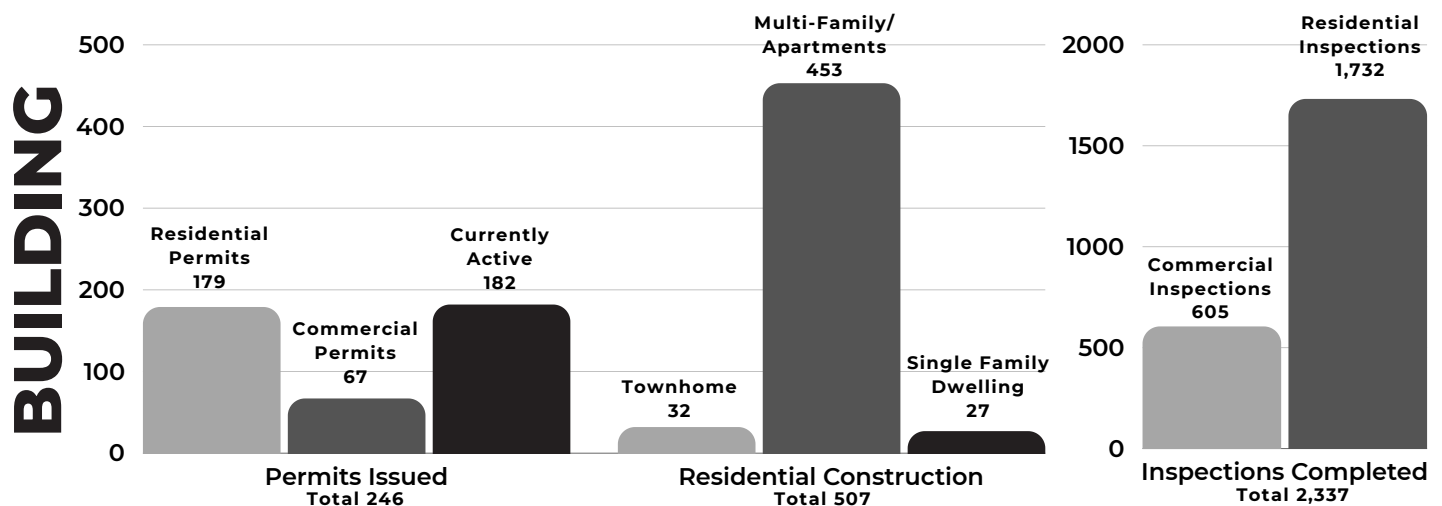
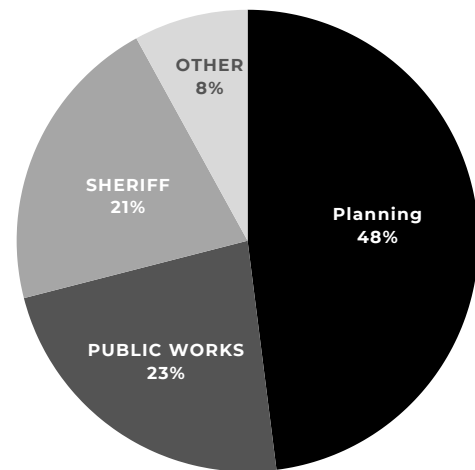
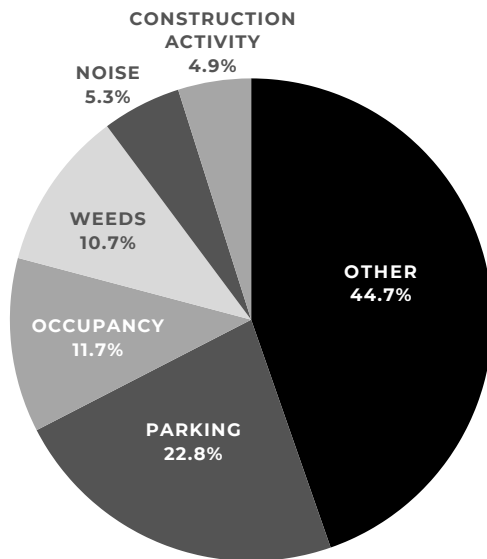
- Constructed Traffic Signal with Pedestrian Crossing at Main Street and 400 North
- Completed 95% of the City-Wide water pipeline upgrade, providing enhanced water service throughout the city.
- Constructed a new phase of Vineyard Downtown infrastructure (Phase 2).
- Added Pedestrian Flashers at Crosswalk at Five locations around Vineyard City's Trails and Pedestrian areas, enhancing Pedestrian and Vehicle safety.
- Along with UDOT, constructed Phase 2 of the Vineyard Connector Extension from Main Street to 1600 North. Constructed 1600 N Rd extension, connecting Lindon Marina to Geneva Rd.
- Vineyard's 6 Million Gallon Culinary Water Tank Completed and 90% complete Vineyard City's booster station
- Installed Three new Traffic Cameras at Center Street & Vineyard Road, Center Street & Mill Road, and Main Street & 400 North, providing public visibility of traffic conditions.



## PUBLIC WORKS

- Repaired failed asphalt for popular 2 bike trails, enhancing safety for Vineyard's outdoor enthusiasts.
- Planted 97 new trees in Grove Park, City Hall and Main St.
- Worked with UVU on the Sunset Park Botany walk, creating an educational hub for UVU students.
- Provided snow removal for record-high snowfall seasons of 2022 and 2023 (an excess of 170% more than prior years), ensuring the safety and accessibility of public streets.
- Upgraded all Reduced Speed School Zone flashers with wireless connections to provide real-time status of school lights and eliminate the need for manual operation.
- Constructed 16 new concrete pads for UTA Bus stop locations, providing safer access for Vineyard residents use of popular transit option

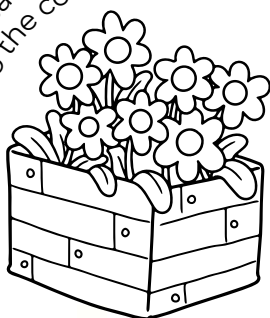

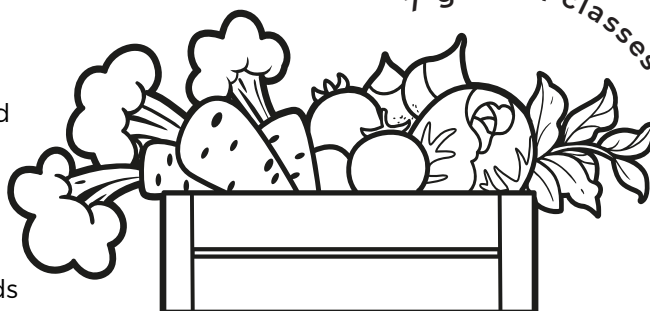
## COMMUNITY GARDEN

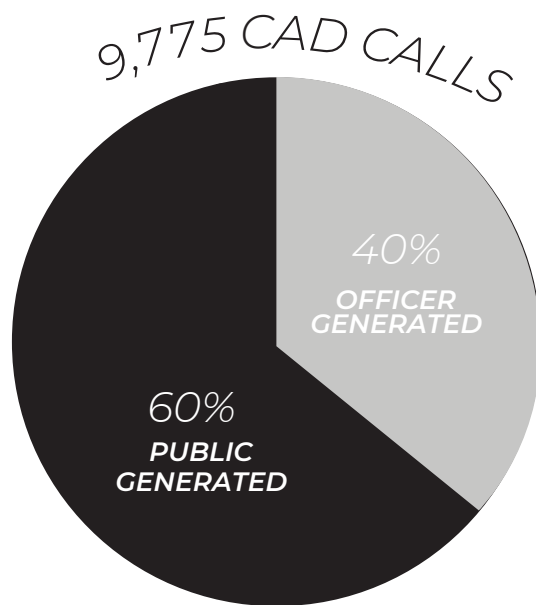

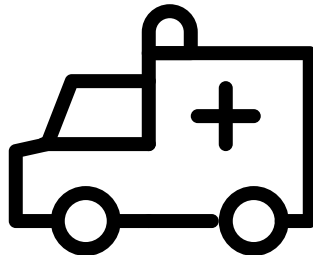
