HOW TO IMPLEMENT A PARKING PROGAM IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD



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WHAT IS THE NEIGHBORHOOD OVERNIGHT PARKING PROGRAM?

Neighborhoods experiencing parking issues may petition and vote to prohibit overnight parking on the public streets in their neighborhood. The program restricts parking from the hours of 1-5am, but allows homeowners to purchase a parking pass to allow overnight parking for one vehicle per household. The program is citizen-led. When a majority of a neighborhood's residents (75 percent) indicate by signature they are in favor of the Neighborhood Overnight Parking Program, the neighborhood can apply for the program. The program is then implemented by the City and towing companies are allowed to tow or boot cars without passes.

This applies only to neighborhoods with city owned streets. We have two parking codes, one enforced by towing companies and one by Sheriff's departments. If you have concerns about private streets, please contact your respective HOAs.

Two options:

Towing-Enforced. Towing 1 a.m. from 5 a.m.

Sheriff's-Enforced. Run by the City, enforced by the Sheriff's 12 a.m. to 5 a.m. (**exception for 55 plus communities)

The program can be a convenient tool for reducing parking congestion and has been a key part of managing and reducing parking issues in participating neighborhoods.



PARKING PROGRAM BENEFITS



REDUCES PARKING CONGESTION

Reduces overall parking congestion in neighborhoods.

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ALLOWS FOR STREET PARKING

Residents with permits are still able to park overnight on public streets, without a total restriction.

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RESIDENT ONLY PARKING

Those without a City-issued parking permit are not allowed to park overnight on public streets in participating neighborhoods.



LATER VISTOR TIMES

Allows for visitors and guests to stay late.



NEIGHBORHOOD ONLY

Prevents neighboring properties from accessing your neighborhood's parking.


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HOA BLUEPRINT

Is a blueprint HOA's may follow to enforce parking on private streets and lots.

CURRENT PARKING PROGRAM

- The program currently runs in two neighborhoods (Providence and part of The Springs)
- The City administers and issues parking passes to residents.
- Vehicle towing and booting is managed through a third-party service. Vineyard City does not provide nor profit from these services. All contact on suspended vehicles will be done through the towing company.





PARKING PROGRAM REGULATIONS

When preparing to implement a parking program, consider the following:

- Homeowners are eligible to sign a petition for an overnight parking program. Renters are not eligible to sign, though they may express concerns to their respective landlords or property managers to influence decision-making.
- To enact the parking program, **75% of homeowners in the neighborhood must indicate by signature they are in favor.** If the program does not reach 75% approval within one year of the start of the process, it will not be implemented. Voting for the program doesn't require homeowners to purchase a pass. Once the threshold is reached, signatures will be validated and the program will be implemented, usually within 60 days.
- Each household will be allotted one parking pass that is valid on the public street in their neighborhood from **1 am to 5 am**. Parking is public and unrestricted outside the hours of 1 am to 5 am. Passes may be transferred between cars. Passes are not transferable between neighborhoods.
- The parking pass is optional. If you do not intend to park on the street between 1 a.m. and 5 a.m., you are not required to purchase one.
- You may purchase a pass at any time after the program has been implemented. Passes are **only valid for the current year**. The pass is available for purchase at Vineyard City Development Services, located at 707 E. Mill Rd, Suite 202 in Vineyard.
- Parking passes are valid for one calendar year. As of this document publication date, passes cost \$60 annually. For the current cost, please refer to the City fee schedule posted on our city website. You will have the option to repurchase the pass annually. Unless a vote to overturn the program is gathered by 75% homeowners, the program will continue after initial implementation.





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VOTING FOR OR AGAINST A PARKING PROGRAM

If a homeowner is in favor of their neighborhood enacting the parking program, they may indicate this by signing and providing their name and address online or on the printed form. If the homeowner is not in favor, no action is necessary.

IMPLEMENTING A PROGRAM IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD

- Social media is a helpful tool in communicating with your neighborhood. Many of the Vineyard neighborhoods have social media groups you can utilize, such as Facebook or GroupMe.
- One of the most effective methods is to canvas your neighborhood and speak with your neighbors directly. Bring along a sign up sheet with a clipboard so those who are willing to sign can share their name, address and emails.
- Print flyers or door hangers with contact information and any relevant dates or timelines.
- The leading community member could track by spreadsheet or other means which neighbors are interested or not interested.
